This extended their undefeated streak in exhibition play — which goes back nearly three years — to 16 games.


But running roughshod over the competition, which Marty Williamson's crew has repeatedly done through late August and early September, just wasn't in the cards during their latest battles.

Bronze medal for skier to close out great season

Paul Macdonald caught one last wave of success before closing the books on a remarkable season.

The Milton barefoot water-skier, who's enjoyed a handsome hardware haul this year, wrapped things up recently with a bronze medal performance in the men's open class of the Canadian Championships in Kamloops, British Columbia.

He went into the national showcase with a top five ranking, and lived up to expectations with strong showings in each of the three events.

"I was pretty excited to finally get an overall medal," said the 23-year-old, who finished fifth in the all-round scoring last year. "It was a great way to end the season."

Highlighting Macdonald's efforts was a third-place in the jump-off. He cleared 47 feet on a second attempt — shattering his mark at the Eastern Canadian Championship last month in Cambridge.

Unfortunately, adverse conditions on BC's Thompson River were a stumbling block to any more top three placings.

In the slalom event — which represents the racing portion of the competition — the local water walker made just over a dozen crossings, which was certainly respectable but only good enough to take sixth spot.


He fared slightly better during the trick event, in which his high-risk routine regularly meets with equally high marks.

Macdonald wasn't far back of overall silver medalist Gordie Croteau of Quebec. Manitoba's Don Baker garnered gold.


