

# Sharp eyed citizen helps cops collar suspects

A citizen who recorded a licence plate number after witnessing a store theft helped lead police to three suspects Monday.

A shopper saw a youth crawl under a fenced area near the entrance to Zellers and steal clothing shortly before 11 a.m. He then fled in a waiting car.

Charged with possession of stolen property and break and enter is a 16-year-old Milton youth. Each charged with possession of stolen property are an 18-year-old Elliot Crescent man and a 16-year-old Milton youth.

The \$130 worth of clothing was recovered.

## Stamp heist

Halton Regional Police are looking for two suspects after \$207 worth of stamps were stolen from the Campbellville post office.

## Police Blotter

The stamps were taken shortly before 5 p.m. Monday when two males entered the store.

The clerk was distracted from the store front when the doorbell rang at the rear.

When the clerk returned, 30 packages of 46-cent stamps were missing.

The suspects are possibly East Indian. They each weighed about 170 pounds and had short black hair.

## Slot thieves

• A 61-year-old Bell School Line woman was arrested after a man's bucket of \$5 tokens went

missing at Mohawk Raceway Monday.

The man was playing slot machines shortly after 10 p.m., then left his \$760 worth of tokens unattended while he went to the washroom. When he came back, they were gone.

A brief investigation led to a theft charge.

• A woman reported her purse stolen from between her feet while she was playing slot machines shortly after 6 p.m. Monday.

The purse was later found in the washroom, minus \$100 from her wallet.

## Break and enter charges

Two people face break and enter charges after a pair of youths were found sleeping in a trailer at the Milton Fair Grounds at 10 a.m. Tuesday.

About \$5,000 damage was caused to the trailer as the culprits broke in.

Several trailers on the property were found damaged.

Charged with break and enter is a 15-year-old Burlington youth and a 16-year-old Milton youth.

## Tools stolen

• More than \$2,000 worth of tools were stolen from a McNiven Road garage overnight August 25.

The thief entered through an unlocked window sometime between 10 p.m. August 25 and 9 a.m. August 26.

• A First Line home was the target of another tool thief August 25.

Sometime between noon and 7 p.m., the culprit took a chainsaw, weedeater and drill among other tools for a loss of \$1,000.

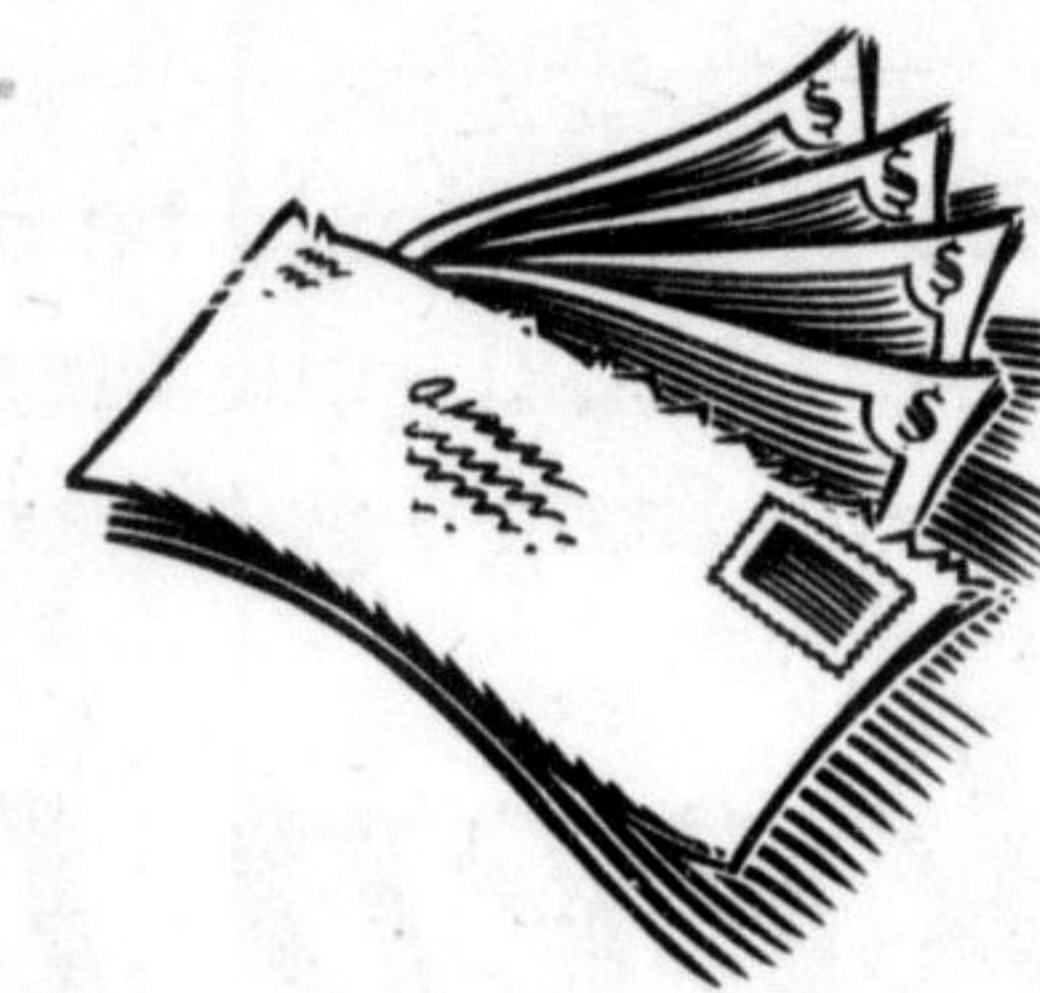
