When it comes to going the distance, very few communities measure up to Milton.

Ten local racers — representing one of the largest groups for any town this size, anywhere in the country — pushed themselves to the limit at Ironman Canada August 29.

Amid picturesque surroundings in Penticton, British Columbia the group who train regularly with both the Milton Runners and Milton Masters Swim Club — battled a grueling 3.8 kilometre swim, 180 kilometre bike ride and 42.2 kilometre

run course.

All 10 managed to complete the journey, each playing a role in an ambitious and successful sports initiative.

"For Milton to have this many competitors at this type of event is amazing," remarked Calvin Snow, the local team's top finisher with a time of 11:14:50 for 343rd place out of 1,775 athletes from 65 countries. "Outside Penticton, there's no other area that had this kind of representa-
