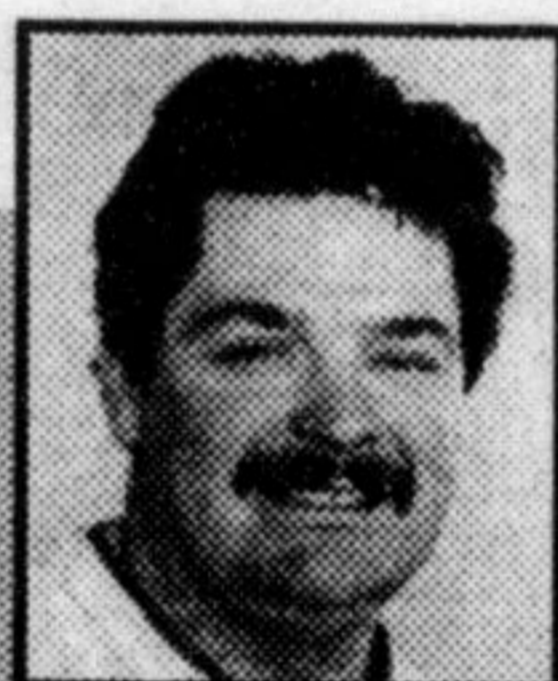

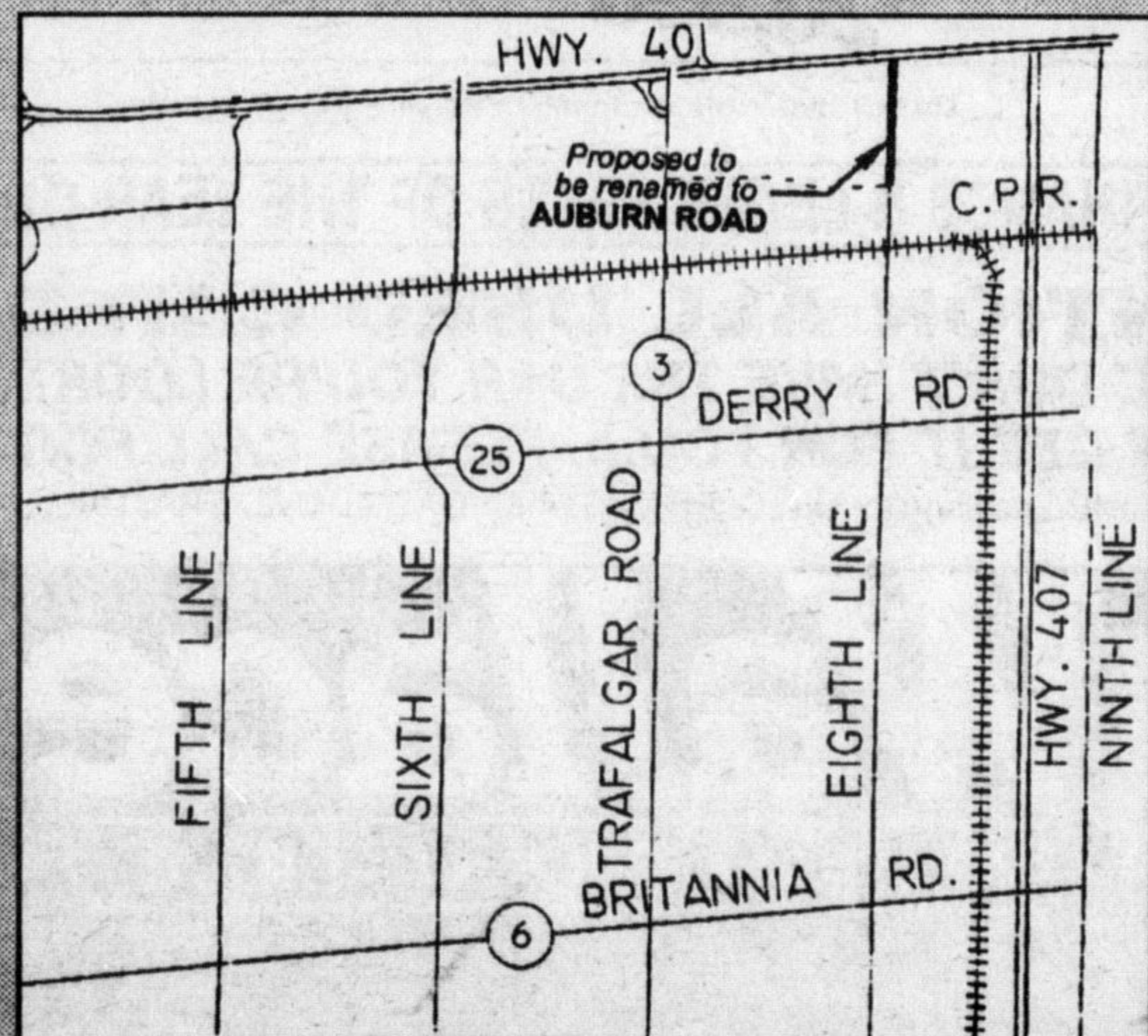
<u>Current Street Name:</u>	<u>Proposed Street Name</u>

Bold thieves steal truck

Crime Stoppers hopes you can help solve the mystery surrounding a truck theft that occurred in Milton on August 23.

During the early evening hours, a truck driver was at the Fifth Wheel Truck Stop located at Hwy. 25 and Hwy. 401.

The driver parked his Mack truck and trailer at the rear of the property. The white 1995 truck's licence plate number was 2099DF. The truck was carrying a trailer with the name LACROIX painted along either side.

The driver had entered the rest area to have dinner and a shower. When he returned a short time later, the trailer had been disconnected from the truck unit and the truck was gone.

Someone must have seen the thieves in action. Perhaps you know who stole the truck. If so, Crime Stoppers wants to hear from you.

If you have any information that leads to an arrest in this or any other case, you may be eligible for a cash reward of up to \$1,000.

You need not give your name and your information can be taken with complete anonymity.

Ms MacFarlane, a wife and mother of two who was cooking French fries for three-year-old son Kyle at the time, stressed that her mailman is being too modest about his contribution in defusing the fire.

She said, "We think he's a hero. I'm asthmatic and the smoke was really bothering me. He took care of everything, even bringing the pot outside. If it wasn't for him, there could have been a lot more damage. My husband and I just want to thank him so much for what he did."

Ms MacFarlane also complimented the fire department for their quick response — as well as thoroughness and sensitivity.

"They got all my pets out just in case and even gave my son a teddy bear. That was really great of them."

The Hemlock Drive woman was treated and released for smoke inhalation that afternoon at Milton District Hospital. While the fire didn't have time to spread, it did cause a fair amount of smoke damage to the kitchen and even part of the second floor.
