In the past, Milton's sole on-call obstetrician has been supported by several family doctors with an interest in delivering babies.

But they pulled out of the specialty when the maternity ward closed and so far, they haven't come back.

"Right up until now most of them are referring patients to me," said Dr. Sharma.

But in the future, that will likely change.

Prior to arriving in Milton, Dr. Sharma spent a year working in Cleveland, Ohio, where he was on call every day save for two weekends per month.

That's perhaps why his current schedule doesn't seem as daunting as it might to others.

"It is very similar in terms of oncall expectations," said Dr. Sharma.

"The difference here is I'm the only person."

But when the population merits it — which is projected to be in about four years — a second obstetrician will be recruited, said Ms McDonell.

And despite a nation-wide physician shortage, that search is expected to be relatively hassle-free.

"My guess is it would be easier to attract a second obstetrician," she said.

In the meantime, Milton's size suits Dr. Sharma's aims.





