

Formula costly

And all it costs is time. In contrast, infant formula can cost up to \$125 a month.

As an international board certified lactation consultant who also works with the breastfeeding clinic at Milton District Hospital, Ms Giacobbo believes in breastfeeding.

"The nutrients in breast milk are so finely tuned to the baby, it boosts their immune systems," she said. "It assures the mom that the babies are getting the best possible food."

It also promotes a closeness between mother and child.

"Certainly there is a bonding with formula," said Ms Giacobbo. "But breastfeeding provides a much more intimate bonding. It is skin to skin with baby and mom."

According to the Canadian Pediatric Association, it is recommended that women breastfeed exclusively for the first four to six months of their baby's life.

So the question is, why aren't more women doing that?

One reason is because it ain't always easy.

Career pressures can cause some women to switch to formula once maternity leave is up.

And the red carpet isn't exactly rolled out for new moms when it comes to public nursing.
