

✓ Police track down suspect on the run

A 24-year-old Milton man faces several charges in connection with an altercation with police November 4.

A suspect was found to be driving dangerously at the Fifth Wheel Truck Stop at about 3:30 p.m. When confronted by police, he fled the area and was apprehended a short time later.

A man was charged with escaping lawful custody, resisting arrest, dangerous driving, impaired driving and driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.

Arrests in robbery

Three Milton teens have been arrested in connection with an October 2 robbery at Super A Video.

All three males were held for bail hearings earlier this month and released on their own recognizance. They face counts of robbery and wearing masks while one of the suspects is also charged with possession of a dangerous weapon.

Man arrested

Police arrested an 18-year-old Milton male on Churchill Road Saturday in connection with a car theft.

At 4:30 a.m., a suspect was discovered driving a late model Chevy Cavalier Z24 that was reported stolen.

He'll appear in court on December 20.

Rash of thefts

Milton motorists are being reminded not to leave valuables in their vehicles — even

when parked in their own driveways — following a rash of thefts over the past two weeks.

The incidents are as follows:

- A stereo and an assortment of compact discs, with a total value of \$4,000, was taken from a 1994 Accura at a Bronte Street townhouse overnight Sunday.

- A purse and cellular phone were removed from a vehicle on Appleby Line overnight last Friday. The stolen items were valued at about \$1,100.

- Two vehicles were broken into on Woodclose Drive Saturday. A briefcase — containing a large amount of cash — was taken from one vehicle while a tape recorder, cellular phone and credit cards were removed from another.

Cars recovered

Three stolen vehicles were recovered in various parts of town earlier this month.

- A 1997 Plymouth Neon — valued at about \$10,000 and stolen from Toronto — was found on Byers Crescent Sunday.

- A 1995 Plymouth Neon that went missing from Toronto was discovered during a routine patrol at 122 Bronte St.

- A vehicle was abandoned after a minor accident on Appleby Line and No. 3 Sideroad November 2. It was later discovered to have been stolen from Guelph.

Police report that a couple of days earlier two men attended the dealership and made inquiries about the vehicle. The sales person got the keys and the younger of the two started up the vehicle, though they declined to

take it for a test drive.

The first male is described as white, 28 to 30 years of age and about five-foot-nine. The second man was between 40 and 45 years old and about six feet.
