'Buy a Bulb' campaign aimed at lighting up services for patients

Christmas has been a whole lot brighter at Milton District Hospital since its 'Buy a Bulb' fundraising campaign began in 1991.

So far, \$340,000 has been raised through this festive fundraiser. The money has been used to purchase hospital equipment.

Donations of \$10 or more are currently being requested to help light the Tree of Caring.

This year, proceeds will go toward a \$69,000 disinfection and cleaning system for endoscopes and other instruments.

The fundraiser follows a 'Twelve Days of Christmas' theme, with ornaments crafted to fit the lyrics of the well-known song.

A donation of \$150 or more will

light a large string of bulbs on the hospital tree.

And donors in this range will receive a glass ball depicting 'Nine Ladies Dancing' as a thank you gesture from the hospital Foundation.

Donations of \$50 to \$149 will set a small string of bulbs alight. Donors in this category will receive a silver and green coloured sled-

shaped ornament.

And donors of \$10 to \$49 can choose between an array of wooden ornaments.

Residents are also invited to remember a loved one with the purchase of a special white light tree bulb.

These donors will receive a keep- tree-lighting ceremony.

Tax hikes are now illegal in Ontario

New bill prevents Ontario governments from raising taxes without public support

Increasing taxes just became illegal in Ontario, said Halton MPP Ted Chudleigh.

"We passed a bill that prevents any (provincial) government from increasing taxes without a plebiscite from the people," he said.

The exception would be in the case of a natural disaster, such as the recent ice storm in Montreal.

But even then, funds should be drained from an already budgeted miscellaneous fund of approximately \$600 million before taxes are touched.

"If it were to exceed that we could run a

deficit or increase taxes without penalty," said Mr. Chudleigh.

"But it would have to be extraordinary circumstances. The ice storm was managed out of miscellaneous funds."

The new bill even takes aim at the government that created it.

Woman abducted, assaulted

Halton Regional Police are investigating a violent sexual assault on a 21-year-old Milton woman last Friday.

The young woman, a hearing-impaired student at the Ernest C. Drury School for the Deaf, said she was sexually abused by two masked men in a white car with tinted windows.

The victim told police she was walking home from school on Parkway Drive shortly after 2 p.m. when she forced into the car by one of the men.

She was bound, blindfolded and brought to an unknown location where the assault took place. She was then driven back to the school and pushed from the car.
