


Tuesday's article regarding a former Milton woman found guilty of welfare fraud was partially incorrect.

Terry Lynn Blanchard, now of Halton Hills, wasn't sent to jail for the crime as falsely stated in the story.

In actual fact, the year in jail ordered by the judge is a conditional sentence.

She was also sentenced to three years probation.

A term of the order is that she's not to apply for welfare assistance while residing with her common-law husband or any other adult for the period of the conditional sentence and proba-

As in the original story, the court also ordered her to pay restitution of \$10,022.

Ms Blanchard recently pleaded guilty in Superior Court in Milton to charges of bilking Halton Region of \$10,022 between October 1, 1994 and August 20, 1995.

She was collecting welfare as a sole support parent while living on No. 15 Sideroad with her common-law husband. The couple have a child.
