

# Shotgun stolen from car at Kelso

Police in Milton are investigating the theft of a shotgun from a parked vehicle at Kelso Conservation Area. If you can solve this theft we are waiting for your call.

On October 15 a vehicle was parked at Kelso, located at 3255 No. 3 Sideroad. While the 1996 Honda was unattended, suspects broke into the vehicle by smashing the right rear passenger window and

stole a 20-gauge Browning double-barrel shotgun.

The serial number of the weapon is 6411B57. It was in a green nylon gun case,

which had a picture of a duck on the side. There was no ammunition with the shotgun. Crime Stoppers reminds vehicle owners and drivers to always lock valuables out of sight when they're stored in a vehicle.

# Man suffers head injuries in assault

Being witness to a fight proved painful for a local man early Sunday morning.

Police report that at about 3 a.m. on Ontario Street, the 25-year-old victim was approached by two young men — one of whom he'd seen involved in another fight a few hours earlier outside Charley Fitzwhiskey's on Ontario Street.

A verbal clash broke out, at which time the victim was punched and kicked repeatedly — sustaining head injuries.

A 29-year-old Milton man was arrested later that day and charged with assault causing bodily harm.

He'll appear in Milton court January 17.

### Rash of charges

A 23-year-old Milton man faces several charges in connection with a lengthy police investigation that culminated with an arrest last Friday.

The suspect — allegedly involved in an incident with firearms on his Guelph Line residence three months ago — faces two counts each of possession of firearms while prohibited, possession of ammunition while prohibited as well as possession of a firearm dangerous to public peace, pointing a firearm at another person and willful damage under \$5,000.

He'll appear in Milton court December 10.

### Suspicious man sought

Police are looking for a man who grabbed a 13-year-old girl during an incident on Commercial Street November 26.

The young girl reported that she was walking home and approached by a man in a beige vehicle.

The suspect asked if she wanted a ride, and when she refused he reached out and grabbed her arm.

But she managed to break his grip and get home safely, police said.

The suspect is described as a white male with brown hair and brown eyes.

### Drugs seized

Two Mississauga males, one a youth, face charges in connection with an evening drug seizure on December 1.

During a routine traffic stop of a '87 Toyota wagon at Sixth Line, police detected the smell of marijuana coming from the vehicle and then found 15 grams of the drug.

Suspects aged 16 and 18-years-old are each charged with possession of a controlled substance.

### Costly distraction

About \$140 was lost when a wallet was removed from a shopping cart at the Milton Mall Shopper's Drug Mart last Friday.

The victim said her wallet was in an unzipped purse in the buggy at 9:40 a.m. but was removed when a young female distracted her.

The suspect was described only as white and about five-foot-six.
