 from GIRL'S EAR on page 2 thread gauze in one side of the ear and out the other to promote healing.

More pills followed. But a subsequent visit to the plastic surgeon meant that 25 days after the infection reared up, she was back on the IV.

So far, Beth is the only Halton resident on. record to report such a dramatic reaction to ear piercing, said Mary Anne Carson, manager of communicable disease services of the HRHD.

She noted that some people are more prone to infection than others.

"There are some individuals who have diseases that affect their immune systems," said Ms Carson, citing diabetes as an example.

But that doesn't apply to Beth, said Ms Wilkinson.

"She's never been sick. Ever."

And despite being blasted by infection fighting drugs, little can be done for Beth's pain.

"It throbs. It burns. It kind of hurts to chew sometimes," said the grade 7 W.I. Dick student.

The HRHD encourages people to see a doctor if any infection above what the piercing site said "It throbs. It burns. It kind of hurts to chew sometimes."

is normal occurs, said Ms Carson.

And Beth's more than qualifies.

"Any kind of infection requiring an IV would in my estimation be a fairly severe one," said Ms

And though cartilage generally takes longer to heal than fatty tissue, just how long depends on the individual.

But cleanliness is essential in warding off infection, said Ms Carson.

"It has to be kept clean. It's an open wound," she said. "Clean off any secretions that come from the wound and ensure the earring inside it is kept clean."

She suggested asking a doctor or pharmacist about the effectiveness of antibiotic creams.


a child, a friend or co-worker can be blessed by the fruit of your labours.




