His sign may read 'Warmest wishes', but Milton's John O'Drowsky is ice cold toward some local bylaws.

Like the one requiring him to pay a \$100 building permit fee as a first step in

erecting a seasonal sign on his property.

The sign, bidding pleasant wishes to passers by, was put up over the Christmas holidays.

But the seasonal cheer backfired when someone called the Town to complain.

Mr. O'Drowsky was then asked to take down the sign, at least until the building permit application was set in motion.

But Mr. O'Drowsky said he resents paying a fee for a sign that he claims fits all the requirements for the area.

"It meets the set back for the sign bylaw, and the size and content, too," he said. "But the Town thinks I should pay \$100 to have a building permit for the sign."

All similar signs require a permit, said the Town's bylaw officer Dick Belford.

"If you don't want a sign, remove it," he said. "If you do, get a permit."

He said the Town isn't intent on singling out Mr. O'Drowsky. It's just trying to do a

"We had a complaint," said Mr. Belford. "When we have a complaint, naturally we have to investigate it and see if it's justified."

Since no permit had been issued, it was justified, he said.

The Town duly sent a letter to Mr. O'Drowsky informing him of the requirement.

But all the fuss over a feel-good Christmas wish has Mr. O'Drowsky think-




