

Heritage preservers honoured

Annual Heritage Awards to be presented at high school Sunday

Milton has a lot of heritage. And to recognize people who have worked hard to preserve it, the Milton Historical Society and Heritage Milton Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee (LACAC) will pre-

sent the 10th annual Heritage Awards. The awards will be given out Sunday from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. in the auditorium at Milton District High School.

In addition to the presentations, there will be displays, entertainment by the Jacqueline Smith Highland Dancers and refreshments.

Admission is free and everyone is welcome.

LACAC will also present heritage plaques.

The presentations are part of Monday's Heritage Day, which is recognized by the federal government.

Bruce Carlin of the Milton Historical Society said it's important to preserve heritage buildings, homes and spaces because they're a link to the past.

"As the old saying goes — if you don't know where you came from, you may not know where you are going."

While Milton has lost some of its heritage, he said there are many significant sites left.

He cited Victoria Park Square, with its rare court building, and the P.L. Robertson factory (where Robertson screws were made) as examples.
