AA minor peewees fall flat in the second half

In a birds of prey clash at Memorial Arena Tuesday, Milton's AA minor peewees simply stopped soaring a little too early.

The Co-Steel Recycling Winterhawks — who heading into last night were one of three rep squads still alive in the provincial playdowns — were sky-high showdown with the Caledon Hawks.

But somewhere around the midway mark of the evening their subtle yet significant descent began.

And by the tail end of the contest they had crash landed and been beat 7-4.

Three unanswered goals in the final frame put the locals on the proverbial chopping block, as they trailed the best-of-five series two games to one before last night's battle in Caledon.

Coach stunned by ending

"I still can't believe they scored three straight on us in the third," remarked bewildered head coach Mike Mangotich.

"I guess it was just defensive lapses in the second half. We didn't know what to do in our own end and that's what made the difference."

A lack of good fortune early on may have had something to do with it as well.

Milton totally dominated all but the last three minutes of the first period, yet came away tied 1-1. Having outshot Caledon 12-4 and not been credited on the scoreboard must have been at least a little disheartening.

Added that in with a hard-fought 2-1 defeat in game one last Thursday, in which they severely outchanced their guests but came up short, and the locals might have gotten a little too frustrated or stopped believing in themselves.

Not that the visitors didn't provide ample competition, but the way Milton thoroughly controlled first-

period play should have offered enough momentum for them to deliver the win.

But a lost step in terms of puck possession and intensity — plus strong goaltending from the opposition — equaled a remarkable reversal of fortune.

Caledon managed just seven shots on net in the opening half, but then capitalized on their hosts' flawed defensive efforts and scored a handful of times over the remainder of the contest.

Captain Matt Lenardon led a spectacular showing in during the initial stages of their game three semifinal his own end during the first period and potted the team's initial marker on a beautiful solo rush.

Milton Residents:

YARD WASTE COLLECTION BEGINS AGAIN IN APRIL!

Remember, hold on to your Yard Waste until separate collection begins.

It starts the week of April 3rd and continues every other week on your Blue Box day until the week of November 27th 2000. Place materials curbside by 7:30 a.m.

- Please keep Yard Waste separate from your garbage and blue box. This avoids confusion during collection.
- Yard Waste must be placed in clear plastic bags (dark bags will not be collected), large paper yard waste bags or open containers (no garbage cans).
- Brush must be bundled and tied, not bagged, no larger than 4 feet long by 2 feet diameter with branches a maximum of 3 inches diameter.
- Yard Waste bags or containers must be no heavier than 23 kg (50 pounds).

WILL COLLECT

- plants
- leaves
- grass
- small branches
- hedge clippings
- small bundles of brush



WILL NOT COLLECT

- tree stumps
- large branches
- untied bundles of brush
- rocks
- soil
- wood building materials


