That, at least, is the indication after only a scant handful of residents turned out for a public information session at Regional Council Chambers Thursday night.


"There's no reason against it," he Man hurt in urban house fire

A man was sent to hospital with smoke inhalation and burns to his feet after battling an early Saturday morning blaze at his Hayward Crescent home.

The fire that caused about \$25,000 damage started after an occupant of the home, the owner's son, put a pot of oil on the stove at about 3:30 a.m., said Don Stewart, chief fire prevention officer for the Milton Fire Department.

The young man, who had just returned home from work, then fell asleep. Fire broke out in the kitchen, activating a carbon monoxide detector and alerting the man to the blaze.

The man's father, who awoke to his son's calls, tried to put out the blaze with a fire extinguisher and then a garden hose. Firefighters arrived and he was taken to hospital. Three smoke alarms were reportedly in the home, but none were working.
