That's the aim behind new patient satisfaction surveys set to be mailed to resi- 1999.

dents who received emergency care at Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital (OTMH) between October and December,

The aim is to find out what's right and what isn't — with patient services. "This information will help guide our future directions and improvements," said

> HHS president and CAO Roger Sharman. "The results will provide us with a better understanding of what we're doing well and where we aren't meeting patient expectations."

> The survey will be mailed randomly to 400 hospital patients. Of those, 300 will be

sent to those who received care at OTMH, with the remainder going to those who visited MDH.

"The emergency questionnaire asks people to evaluate items including waiting time, registration process, physician and nursing care received, communication, discharge and billing," said Lisa Droppo, HHS Ombud. There is also room for personal comments.




