## Two hard-working women up for award

For Ms Doddington, opening up her own private daycare in the 1980s was a result of the frustration she felt as a worker in the industry.


"I thought, I've either got to get out of the profession or try to change it," she


She chose the latter, buying an existing centre at the back of a church. When she took over the 65-capacity school, only 11 children were enrolled.
