

Nipissing Rd. businesses ransacked

Several businesses on Nipissing Road were broken into on the evening of March 28.

At Joe's Wholesale Produce, the front door was forced open and thieves stole three bottles of liquor and some Italian money. The value was estimated at \$150.

Houseware Sales Ltd. also had its front door pried open, but it's not known what was taken.

The side door of Smelko Foundry Products Limited was pried open. Thieves stole a set of golf clubs worth about \$2,000.

Halton Regional Police are investigating.

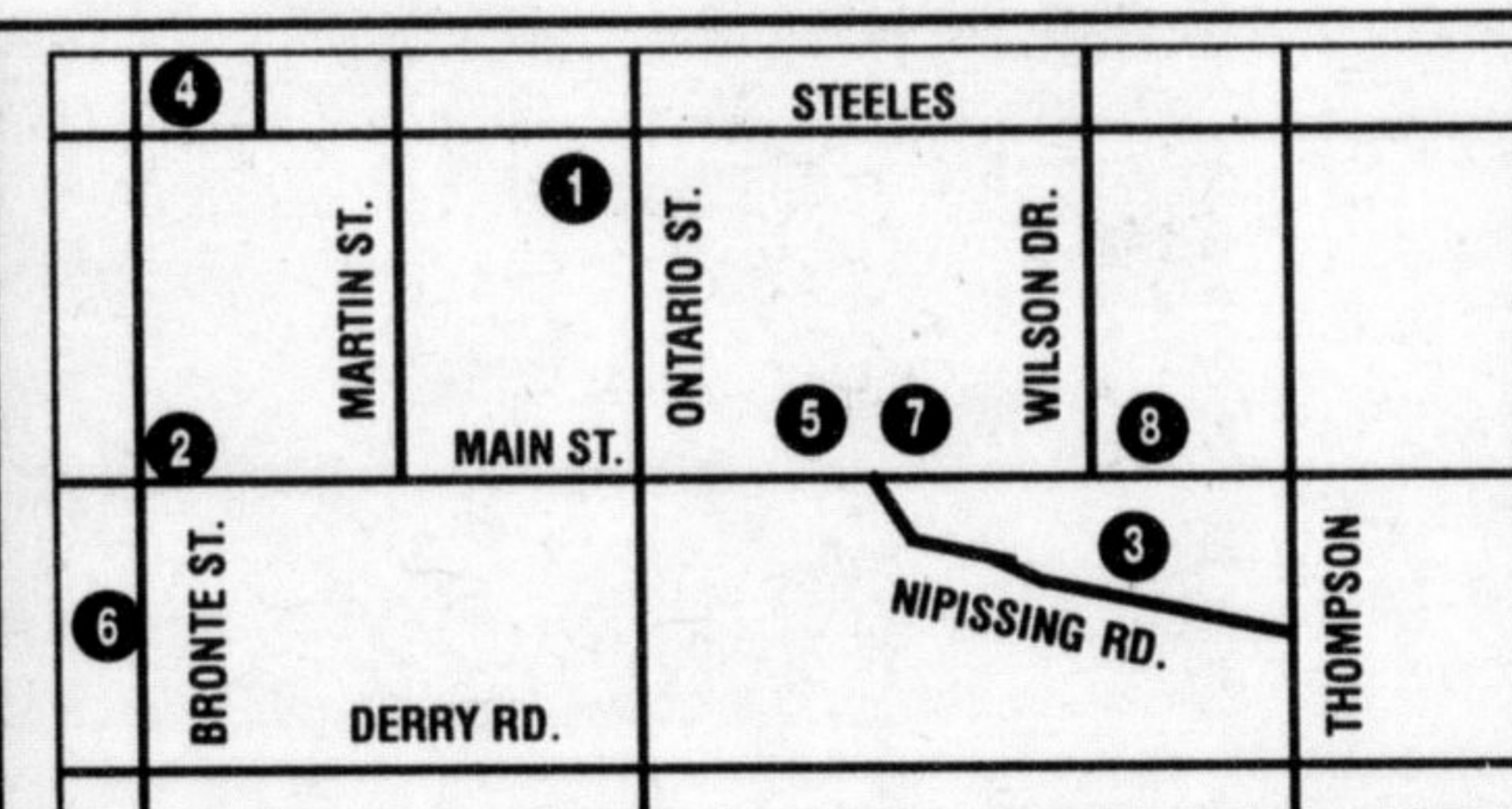
