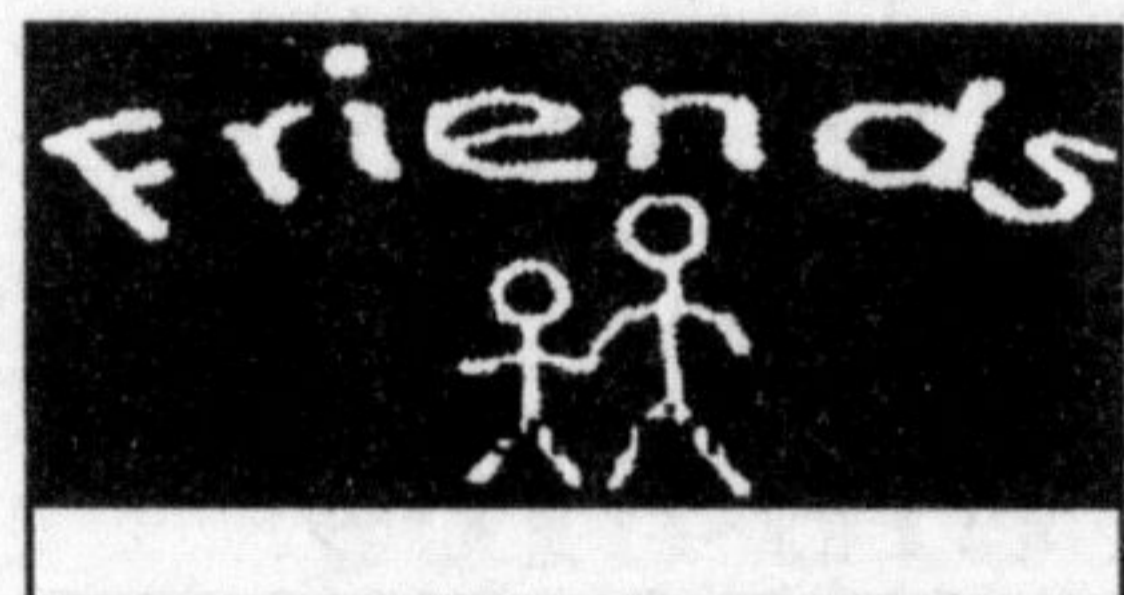

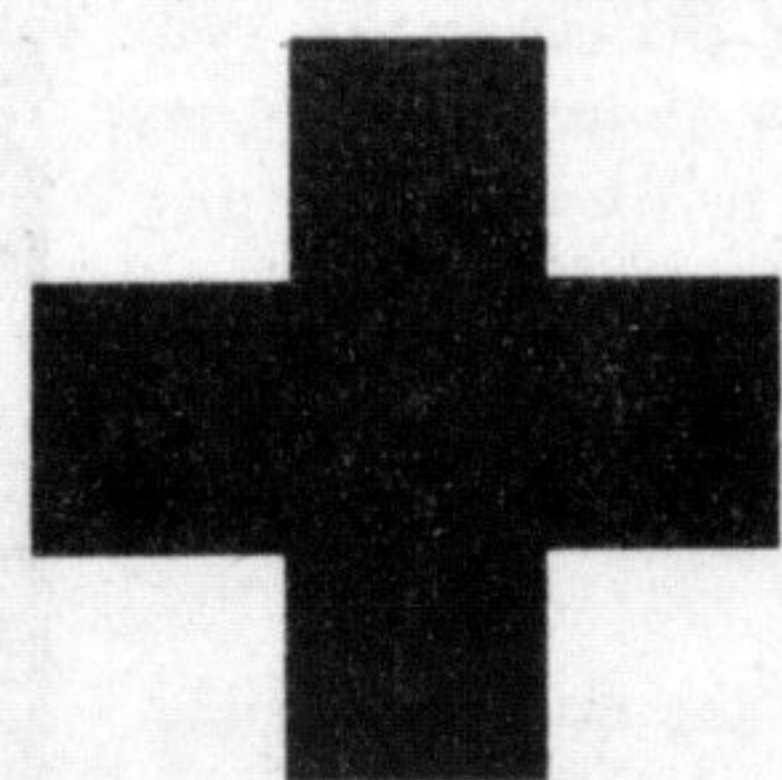

**The Halton Social Planning Council and Volunteer
Centre Celebrates The Volunteers of Yesteryear and
Today During National Volunteer Week, April 9 - 15.**

Milton will join communities across the country to recognize the contributions of Canadian volunteers during National Volunteer Week, April 9-15. This year's theme, "Volunteering, a time-honoured tradition", sets the stage for Volunteer Centres, and member agencies to thank both the volunteers of yesteryear and the volunteers of today.

National Volunteer Week is an opportunity to celebrate Milton's volunteers and their vital contribution which make our communities strong and Canadian society as a whole.

Lila Goodspeed, President of the Board of Directors of Volunteer Canada, says "National Volunteer Week provides the perfect opportunity to reach out and thank our volunteers; it is a time to recognize the valuable contribution volunteers make to the health of our communities. Volunteers are truly Canada's finest natural resource."

"Our country was built on the generosity of volunteers - caring for the sick, feeding the hungry, even helping clear your neighbour's land are all part of our history," says Paddy Bowen, executive director of Volunteer Canada. This year National Volunteer Week encourages Canadians to reflect on the contributions volunteers have made in the past. It is also a time to recognize the 7.5 million volunteers active today - the people who are out there making a difference," says Bowen.

National Volunteer Week began in 1943 as volunteer recruitment effort to enlist women for wartime voluntary service. The concept of a week

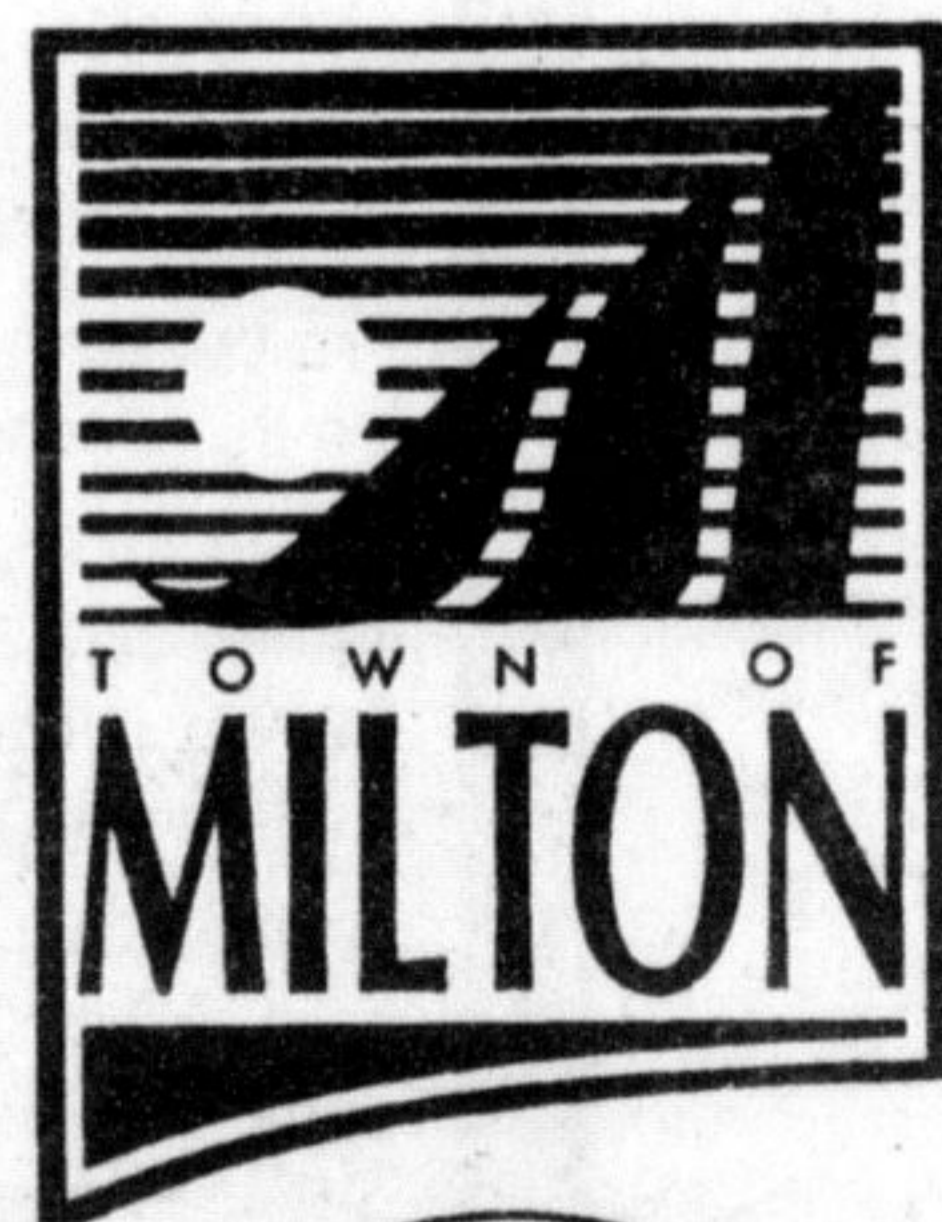
devoted to volunteers was revived during the 1960s. In 1990 Volunteer Canada proclaimed the third week in April as National Volunteer Week, a time to recognize the contribution of volunteers from coast to coast.

There are over 10,000 volunteers in the Milton area. People searching for ways to enrich their lives are donating time and skills to the community. The Halton Social Planning Council and Volunteer Centre serves the community as an advocate and catalyst for volunteerism, providing leadership and support for volunteer efforts and operating as central clearing house for volunteering.

National Volunteer Week is significant because the work of volunteers impacts virtually every aspect of society, including health, education, social services, youth culture, sports and recreation, the arts, and the environment. The week is also important because it helps many agencies to recruit new volunteers and to retain those who are already involved.
