



The Halton Social Planning Council and Volunteer Centre Celebrates The Volunteers of Yesteryear and Today During National Volunteer Week, April 9 - 15.

Milton will join communities across the country to recognize the contributions of Canadian volunteers during National Volunteer Week, April 9-15. This year's theme, "Volunteering, a time-honoured tradition", sets the stage for Volunteer Centres, and member agencies to thank both the volunteers of yesteryear and the volunteers of today.


National Volunteer Week began in 1943 as volunteer recruitment effort to enlist women for wartime voluntary service. The concept of a week


