

## Dynamos dominate provincial showcase

Talk about a near perfect performance. Milton's Dynamo Wrestling Club sent a handful of grapplers to the Ontario Youth

showing ever, by securing his third consecutive provincial title. He won three straight matches — two by way of pin fall — en route to overall victory among the bantams.

His victims included opponents from Brampton, Renfrew and the Goodwood Gators.

#### Dynamos display depth

Needing one extra win to top their respective divisions were rookie bantam Liam Tennant plus kids class participants Shea Deli and Aaron Stone.

Tennant made his provincial debut a memorable one with a technical superiority triumph and three pins, including one in the finals.

Pinning all four of his opponents and claiming his first Ontario crown was Stone. He dominated a Sunderland wrestler to complete his title drive.

Deli won his second straight provincial championship with three pin falls and a Veteran Dynamo Gary Ferrier led the decision. His toughest test came in the medal march, and the local club's finest semifinal round, where he upstaged a Durham Impact opponent 4-0.

> Meanwhile, rookie Nick Ronan rounded out the hardware haul by taking bronze.

> The five medallists will lead the local club into battle next weekend, when they host to the Canada-East Championships at E.C. Drury High School.

> Approximately a dozen local wrestlers will participate while overall the event should feature 200 grapplers between the ages of 10 and 14.

Preliminary competition will run Saturday, April 29 with the finals set for the following afternoon.

Last year the Milton Dynamos captured three medals — including a gold won by Ferrier.


