TAX NOTICE

Ratepayers of the Town of Milton are reminded that the 2nd installment of the Interim Tax Bill is due on April 28, 2000 If you require information about taxes, please contact the Corporate Services Tax Department at (905) 878-7252, ext. 393, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.

Tax payments must be received in the Corporate Services Office on or before the due date to avoid penalty. Late payment charge of 1 1/4% will be charged on the first day of default and on the first day of each calendar month in which the default continues. It is the responsibility of the ratepayer to ensure that the taxes are paid by the due date, even in the event that the bill is not received as mailed.

Taxes may be paid:

- a) By mail to the Corporate Services Tax Department, 43 Brown St., Milton ON L9T 5H2. Cheques post-dated to the due date are acceptable and encouraged.
- b) By phone if you bank with Canada Trust, TD Bank, CIBC, Royal Bank or Bank of Montreal. Please call them for details.
- c) By using the mail deposit box to the left of the glass doors at Town Hall.
- d) Between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the Corporate Services Tax Department, Town Hall, 43 Brown Street, Milton. (Cheque or money orders preferred rather than cash). Direct Debit now accepted.
