

Junior Red Sox trimmed by Brampton in season opener

Milton delivered a respectable return to junior competition at Brian Best Park Sunday.

Unfortunately, a depleted lineup and lack of timely hitting prevented them from making a triumphant one.

The Red Sox were missing nearly half their roster — due to work commitments as well as various ailments — and stranded a dozen runners on base.

These shortcomings were more than the local lads could overcome, as they were eventually outdistanced by the Brampton Red Sox 8-6.

Manager Glen Turner said that given the circumstances, he was quite pleased with the team's junior debut.

"For the most part we played a very solid game against one of the stronger teams in the league. The pitching held up well," he remarked. "We just came up one hit short there at the end."

Milton battled back from a five-run deficit, but its plate pop fizzled down the stretch — with just a single hit registered over the last three innings.

Steven Jay, Matt Dickson and Andrew Coe split the pitching duties into even thirds. Each gave up three hits and collectively surrendered a handful of earned runs.

Brampton did the rest of its scoring by stealing home three times.

Coe initiated the hosts' comeback campaign in the fifth, lashing out a double to

cash in Bud Hall and Kurt Mitchell.

One inning later the local boys would close the gap with another four runs — brought in by Coe, Todd Black, Mike Austen and Taylor Lawton.

Mitchell, Hall, Craig Hudak and Gord Morrison recorded the RBI.

The visitors would bring in two more runs in the eighth to reestablish their lead, and barely held on for the victory as Milton had the winning run at the plate in both the eighth and ninth frames.

Standing out defensively for the local club — at shortstop and centre field respectively — were Lawton and Black.

Lawton engineered the first double play of the year in the second inning and made five put outs in total.

Black meanwhile, snagged three fly balls in the fifth.

Among those unavailable for the season opener were Paul Faggion, Jordan Jeans, Bobby McKnight and slugger Nathan Perrott.

Milton will continue its 27-game regular season schedule in Erin Mills Thursday. At Brian Best Sunday afternoon they will play host to the Burlington Bulls. Game time is 1 p.m.

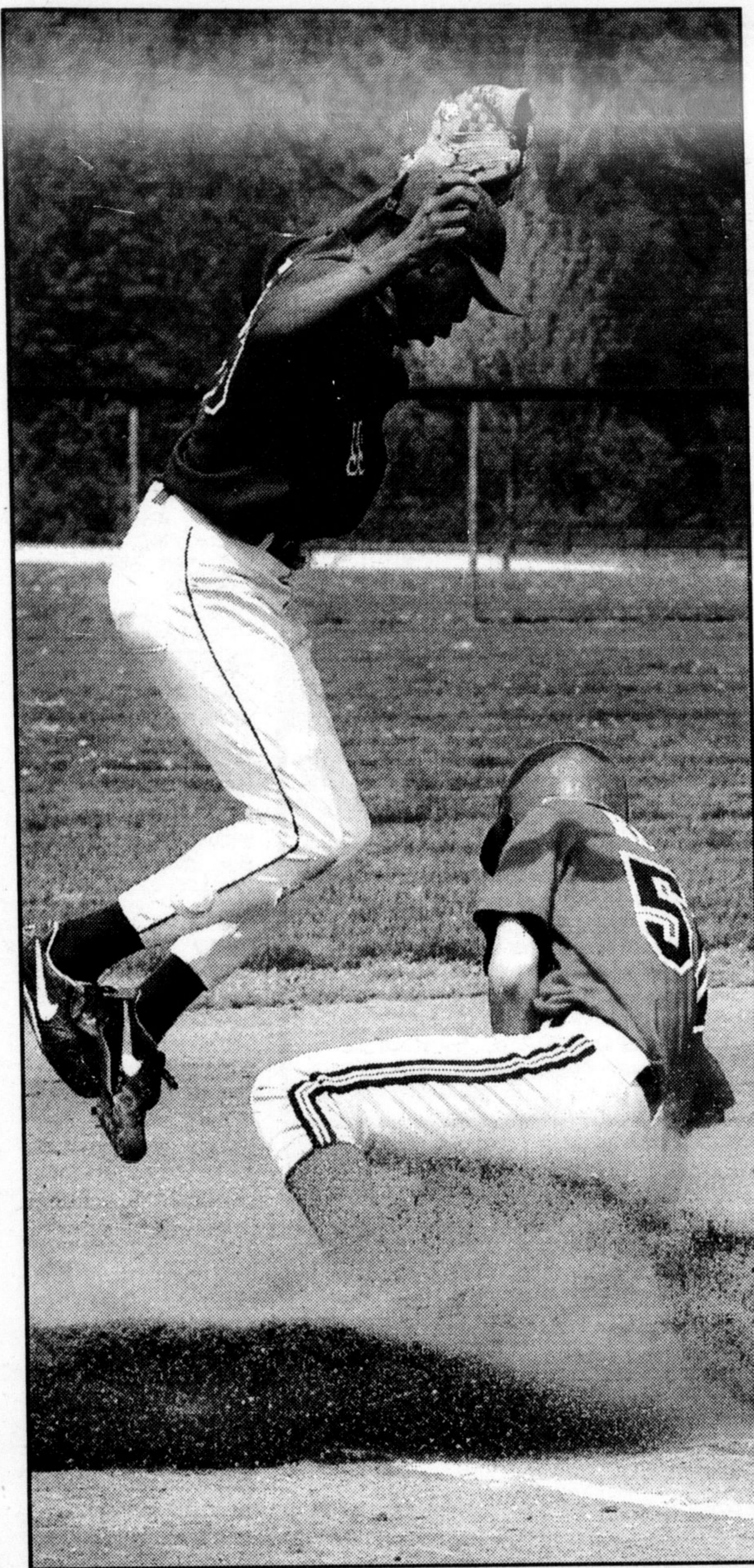
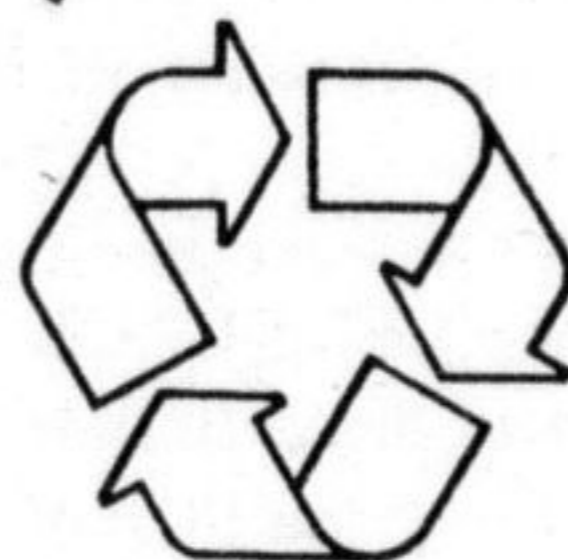
