If you're heading to the beach this long weekend with your baby, please remember that babies have delicate skin which must be protected from irreparable sun damage. Keep babies under one year old out of direct sunlight, either in a covered stroller, under an umbrella or in the shade. Shield their skin with hats and loose fitting clothing. Closely-knit fabrics block out most of the sun's rays and long-sleeved shirts and long pants will cover up most of their body. It is recommended that you do not use sunscreen on babies under six months.

## 'March for Jesus' in Milton June 10

The global March for Jesus has been called the largest grass roots movement in the world.

Soon, Milton residents can participate in the fourth and final local march, taking place Saturday, June 10.

So far, seven Milton churches are taking part in the march, which will set off from Rotary Park at noon. Participants are asked to gather at 11:45 a.m. It's expected to last an hour, and will culminate with a worship service, also at Rotary Park.

The march is intended to allow Christians to jointly display their devotion to God.

"The idea was to bring people of all Christian denominations together," said local organizer Lorrette Shermet. "We all believe in the same God."

March for Jesus was conceived as a millennium event, and the debut walk took place in Britain in 1980. This year alone, about 150 countries, totalling about 15 million participants, are expected to join in.
