Police Blotter

Tractor-trailer unit stolen from eatery over last weekend

A tractor-trailer unit worth about \$110,000 was stolen from the Chalet restaurant on Regional Road 25 sometime between Saturday at 5 p.m. and Sunday at 9:30 a.m. The keys weren't in the vehicle.

A 1989 black Pete 379 CT truck and a 35-foot long dump truck-style silver trailer were taken in the heist.

Vehicles damaged

Nine vehicles were damaged at the Wallace car dealership on Main Street sometime between May 10 and 15.

The hoods of the vehicles were scratched causing between \$200 and \$300 worth of damage to each car.

The vehicles included a 2000 Pontiac Sunfire, two 1999 Safari vans, a 1999 Pontiac TransAm, two 1998 Pontiac Transports, a 1997 Pontiac Sunfire, a 1997 Pontiac Safari and a 1996 Ford Windstar.

Hunting bows stolen
