used an orange juice combination, she said. The pair then added cranberry juice to make it look like a sunset. Ice cream was added because it should go in everything, Ms Bekeris said.




The pair choose a message that told people not to drink and boat.

Ms Bekeris said they created the drink over the course of two weekends.








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
