





# Storm doesn't dampen Doc's bid for victory

Not even a 24-hour delay could deter the 'Doctor' from delivering on call in the \$80,500 final of the Mohawk Pacing Series for three-year-old colts.

Displaying the exact precision of a surgeon, Doc Vinall confidently rolled past horses in the stretch to capture the event for Milton driver Chris Christoforou in 1:53.2.

Gehrig, after leaving alertly for pocket position from the nine hole, was two-and-a-half lengths back in second while Doc Vinall's stablemate,

Ready Steady Go, cut the mile but had to settle for third.

#### Storm delays race

The race was contested as a non-wagering affair before the start of the regular Saturday program after a severe electrical storm Friday night wiped out the balance of the card after seven races.

As expected, Ready Steady Go utilized his swift early foot to take the field through the quarter in :27.3 and :56.3 for the half with Gehrig neatly tucked in second.

Doc Vinall, a bay son of No Nukes, calmly took back in sixth until Christoforou—returning from an ankle injury—began his charge at the half and narrowed the gap on the leaders by the 1:25 three-quarter mark.

Upon reaching the straight-

away, the Doc sailed on by for the victory.

Trained by Nat Varty for owner Perfect World Enterprises, Doc Vinall has turned into a terrific investment after his purchase for \$72,000 US at the Meadowlands Sale in January.

Since moving into the Varty stable, Doc Vinall boasts seven wins, one second and three thirds for earnings of \$124,512.

His lifetime bankroll now reads \$152,960.

"He's a tough horse and I thought first over would be too bad if the fractions were right and they were," said Christoforou.

"After tonight's performance he fits in with the top colts. Once

"I pulled the plugs at the top of the stretch he took off and about 100 yards from the wire I took a hold of him. He was a strong winner."

Next up for the speedy sophomore is a trip to Pocono Downs for this weekend's eliminations of the Miller Memorial.

The Mohawk Pacing Series was open to three-year-olds who were non-winners of \$50,000 in 1999.
