Two students from Kenya were among the graduates of the Electrolysis College of Canada last week.

Beth Kihara and Rosemary Mwaura travelled from their home continent to enrol in the program.

"I've enjoyed my time thoroughly," said Ms Mwaura. "I've never enjoyed a course so much in my life."

She said she intends to follow up her Milton training with a two-year cosmetology course in California.

Ms Mwaura first heard about the college through the Internet. "I booked it immediately," she said. "You want the best, you go for the best."

Eventually, Ms Mwaura said she hopes to open her own school in Kenya.

"I want to give my students the best, just as I've been given the best," she said.

But Ms Mwaura isn't just a student at the school. She's also a client, having had her eyebrows permanently tweezed during her time in Milton.

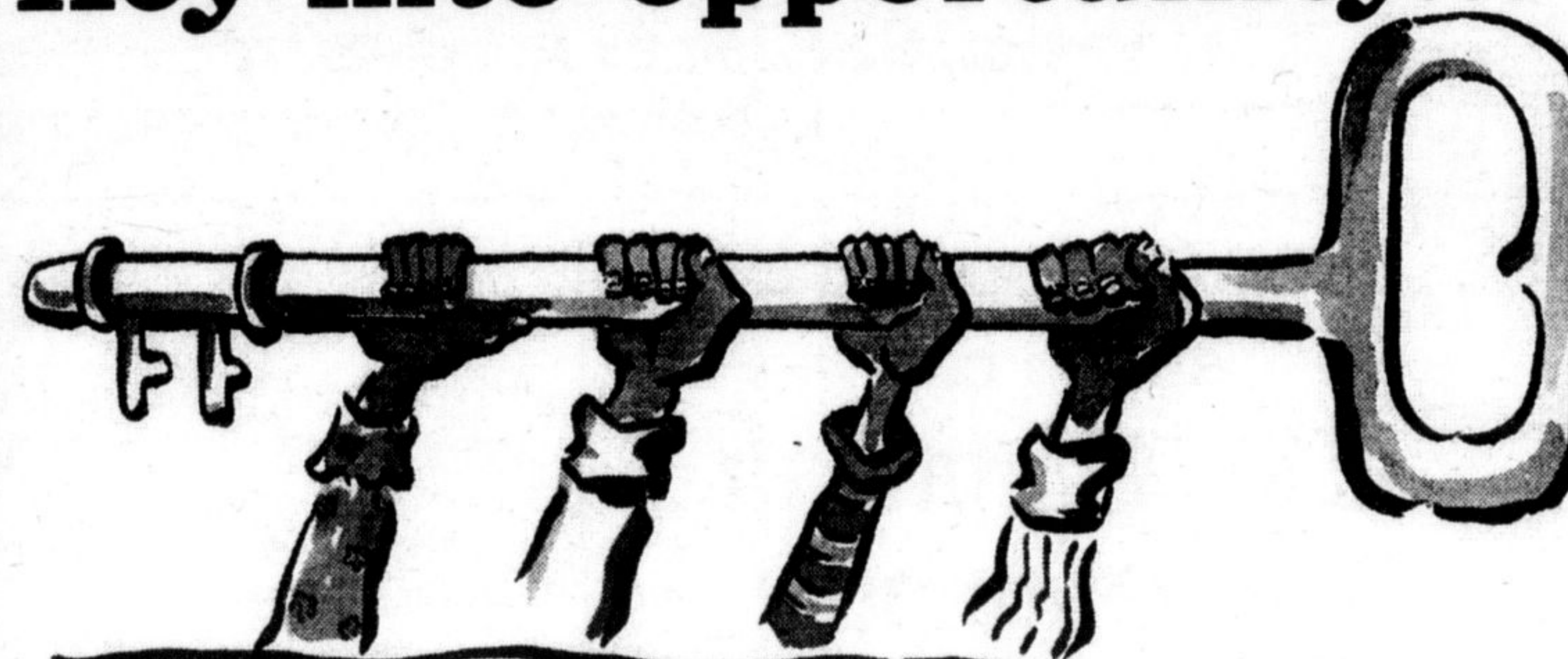

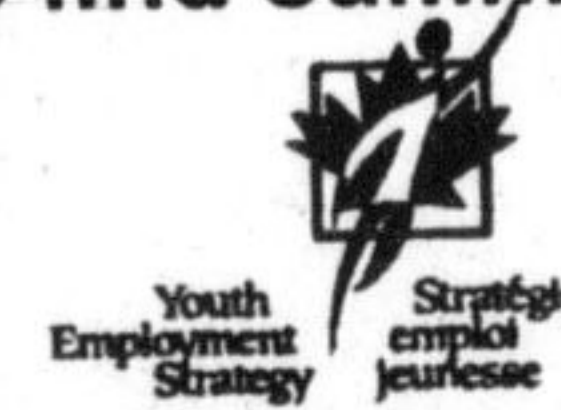
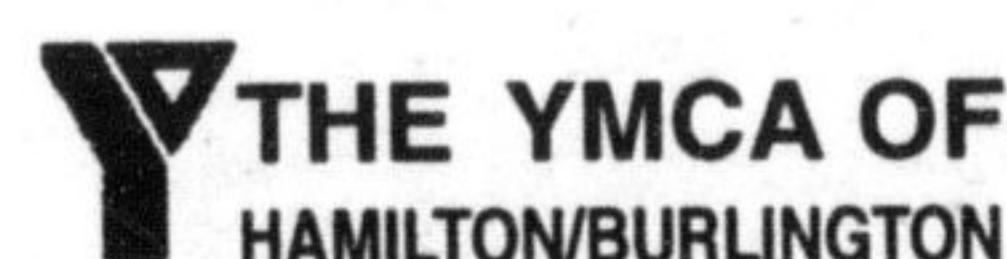
