"We're fair and equitable and our workmanship speaks for itself," she said.

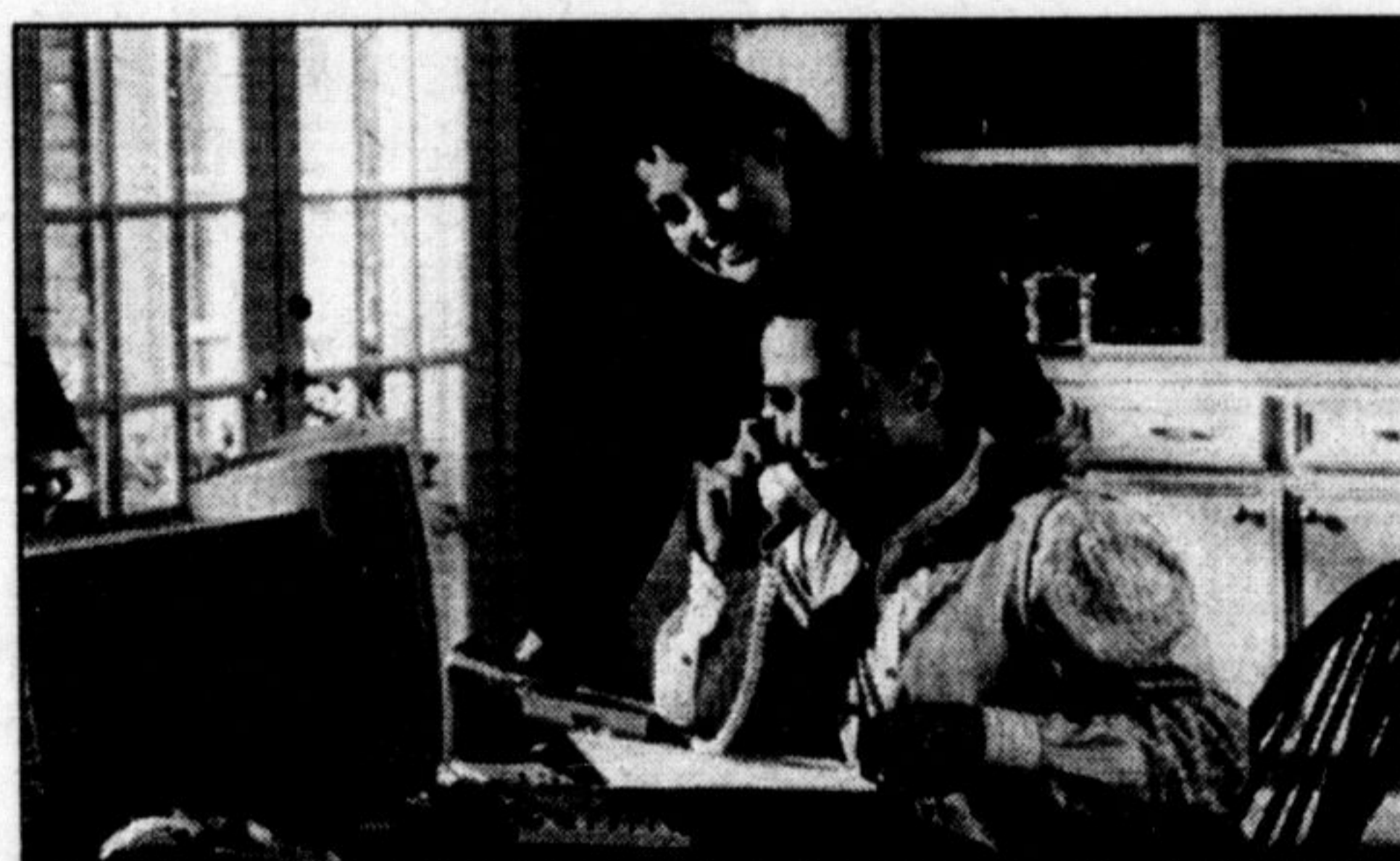
Unfortunately, it hasn't spoken that loudly in her own hometown — and that's something she and Mr. Laurin hope will soon change.
