OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 7 OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton passed By-law No. 50-2000 on the 12th day of June, 2000 under Section 17 of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, as amended, which adopts Official Plan Amendment No. 7.

The purpose of Official Plan Amendment No. 7 is to redesignate certain lands - Urban Area Land Use Plan; rename the planning districts and modify their boundaries - Urban Area Planning Districts, Character Area and Community Improvement Area; additions to the Urban Area Transportation Plan and replace the existing Milton 401 Industrial Park Secondary Plan in Section C.2 of the Plan with a Secondary Plan for the Milton 401 Industrial/Business Park Planning District.

The amendment affects the lands within the Milton 401 Industrial/Business Park which is bounded by No. 5 Sideroad, the North Hydro Corridor, Highway 401, Steeles Avenue, Martin Street, a former railway right-of-way, the CNR rail line, Sixteen Mile Creek, Peru Road, a Sixteen Mile Creek tributary and Tremaine Road.

AND TAKE NOTICE THAT any person or agency wishing to request a referral of Official Plan Amendment No. 7 or any part of the Plan to the Ontario Municipal Board, may do so by filing with the Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton, a Request for Referral to the Ontario Municipal Board under Section 17(11) of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, as amended. The Request for Referral shall include therewith, a statement in writing setting out the reasons for such request. 

# Investigators don't know how victim died: trial

When Stephen Andreopoulos rented a U-Haul cube van on July 2, 1996 from the owner of the Maple Auto Centre on Major Mackenzie Drive, he promised he would return it the next day, a jury heard Tuesday.

Testifying in the on-going first-degree murder trial in Superior Court in Milton, business owner Paul Tannous said he never saw Mr. Andreopoulos again.

The van, though, was found abandoned the next day in a Longo's parking lot at Dundas Street and Trafalgar Road.

Mr. Andreopoulos, 36, was last seen alive leaving the service station with former Milton resident David Fiorino, 27, who has been charged in the death.

Mr. Tannous told the jury that Mr. Fiorino approached him about renting a van so his friend could help him move some boxes from him home in Maple to his cottage in Barrie.

On July 2, Mr. Fiorino, Mr. Andreopoulos and another man (Dominco Sacco) met at his service station.

While Mr. Andreopoulos was filling out the contract, the two men were in Mr. Fiorino's Pontiac. Afterward, Mr. Andreopoulos joined the pair. Mr. Tannous told the jury when he looked out his office window he could see the three of them talking.

Several hours later, "I saw the U-Haul drive away along Major MacKenzie. The Pontiac followed it," he said.

On Monday, forensic pathologist Dr. Mark Bullock testified at the trial.

On February 16, 1998 — two days after Mr. Andreopoulos' body was found buried six-feet deep at a property on Derry Road in Milton — Dr. Bullock completed an autopsy, preparing several reports.

The jury heard that Dr. Bullock's job was to determine how the victim died.

"We were not able to find an exact cause of death. One major reason was the body was badly decomposed."

Court heard bruises were found on both of Mr. Andreopoulos' cheeks and above his temple. He also had cuts on his wrists and ankles. The injuries happened before death occurred.

There were also large gapping holes in the left side of his upper chest, arm and thigh as well as a tear in his left lung and diaphragm. All of these injuries happened after death, Dr. Bullock said.

Crown attorney Brian O'Marra asked if a backhoe could have made the holes, and he agreed that they could have.

During cross examination, defence lawyer Robert Nuttall asked whether there were any other signs of pre-death trauma.

"No gunshot? No bludgeon? No knifing?" he asked the doctor.

There was not, he said.

He also asked whether Mr. Andreopoulos was buried alive.

Dr. Bullock said he didn't think he was because there was no foreign material in the mouth or nose.

Mr. Nuttall then asked whether there would be any evidence in the body if someone died of an irregular heartbeat.

Dr. Bullock said it wouldn't, but added "usually those people are not found buried six feet under."

The trial continued yesterday.
