Girl falls from cliff at Rattlesnake Point

A 10-year-old Guelph girl was lucky to escape serious injury after falling 15 feet from a cliff at Rattlesnake Point last week.

The girl was at the popular tourist destination with a Guelph-based group

called the Trail Blazers at about 4:45 p.m. July 13 when she slipped while climbing out of a cave, said Det. Larry Brassard of Halton Regional Police.

Suffering chest and back pains as well as abrasions to her head, she was taken

by ambulance to Milton District Hospital.

Her injuries were described as non-life threatening.

Rattlesnake Point is a haven for rock climbers and cave explorers.

One of the people at the Halton Outreach Firearms Office display had a \$350 camera taken.

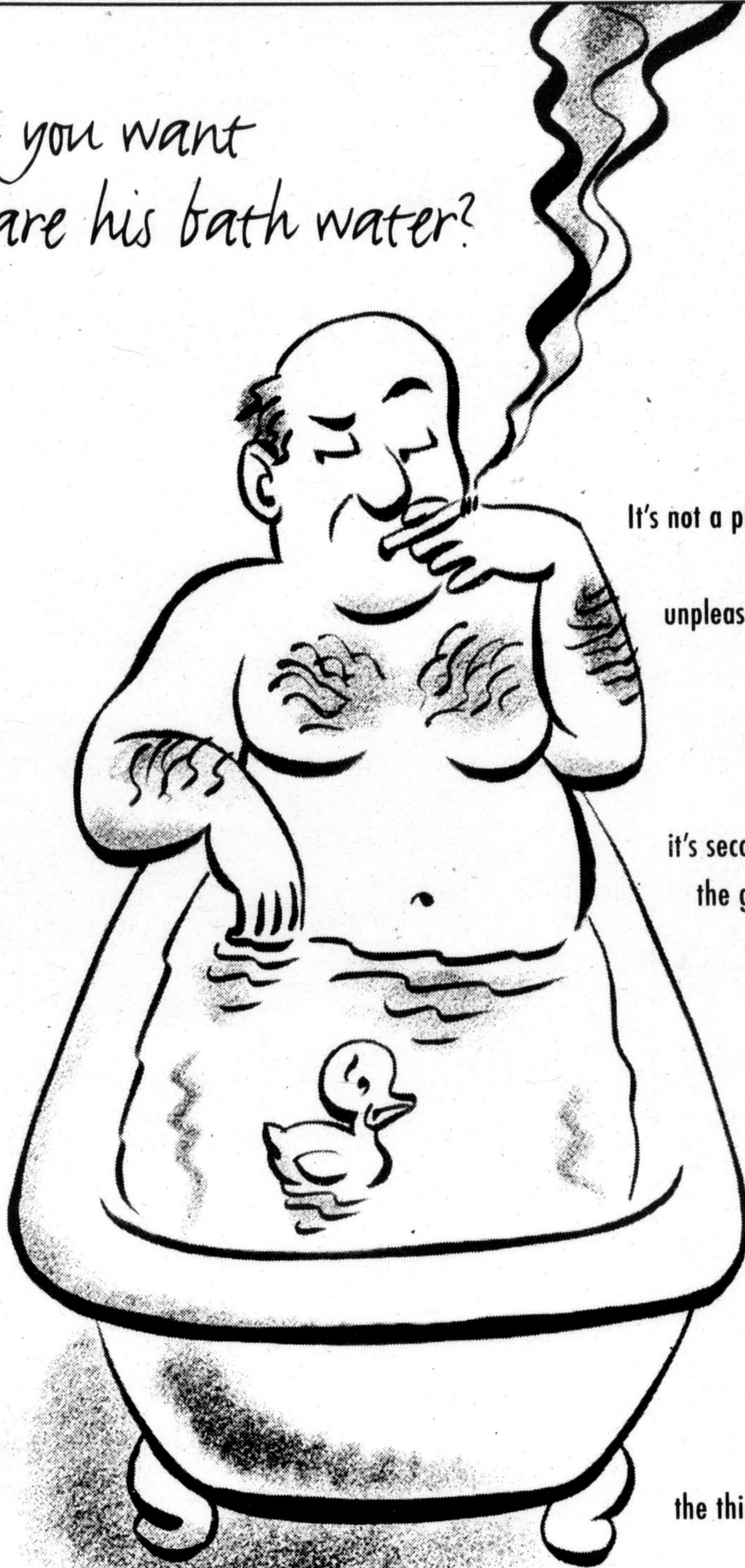
Window broken

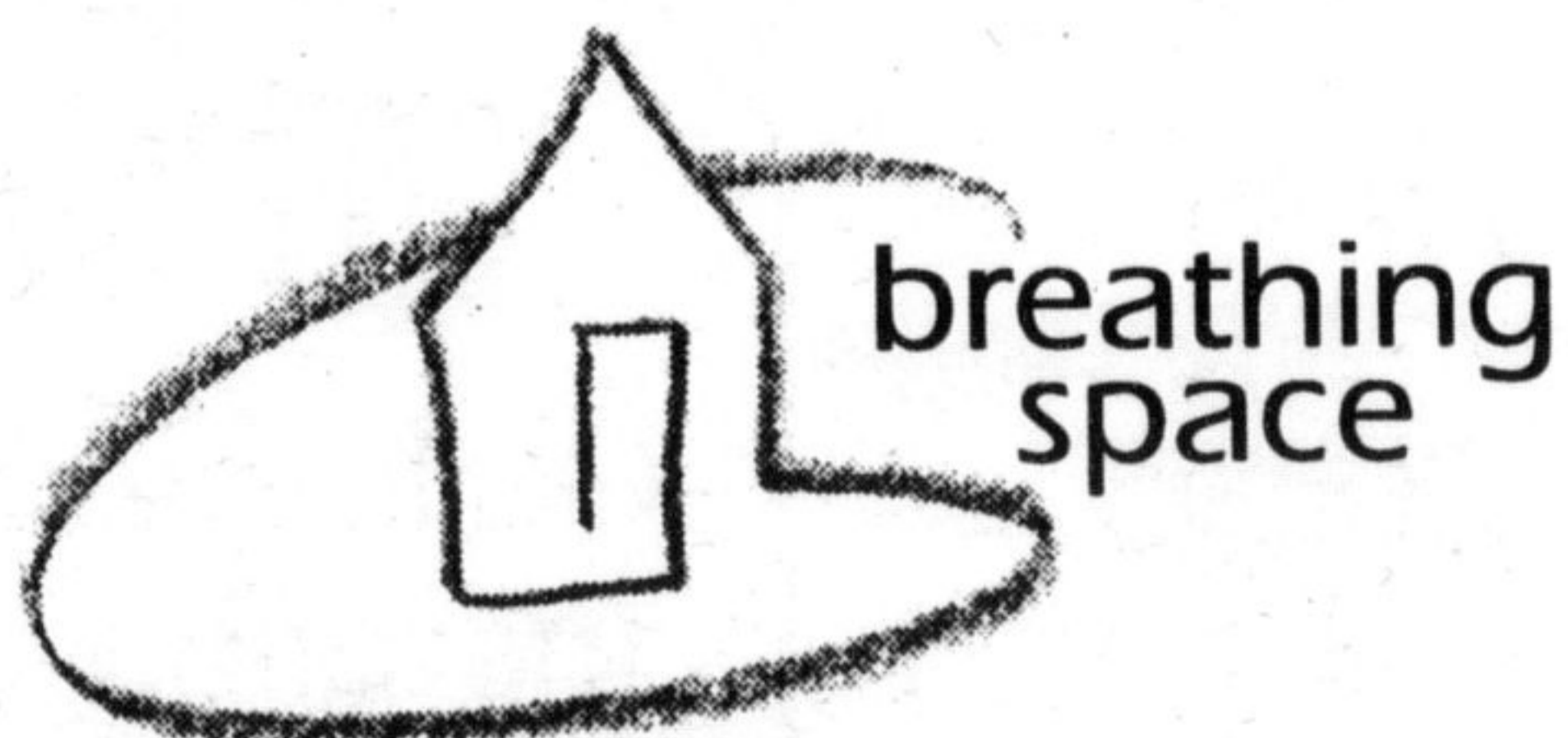
