

# Construction trailer parked on Fourth Line broken into

A construction trailer parked on Fourth Line south of Derry Road was broken into between 11 a.m. last Friday and 5:50 a.m. Monday.

The trailer belonged to D-K Equipment of London, which has a contract with Mattamy Homes. A TV, microwave and tools were stolen.

The loss totalled \$6,450.

### Vehicle recovered

A vehicle stolen from a Mississauga home in May was discovered Tuesday at Fifth Line and Lower Base Line at about 2:50 p.m.

A black 1995 two-door Acura was found without wheels, the rear window smashed, the steering column damaged and profanity scratched on the roof.

The vehicle was worth about \$5,000.

### Bike recovered

A 16-year-old Ontario Street youth has been charged with possession of stolen property and theft.

# Murder suspect told undercover cop he killed Andreopoulos: trial

On the way back from a meeting, murder suspect David Fiorino told an undercover police officer that he killed Stephen Andreopoulos.

"He went on to say he killed Stephen Andreopoulos," OPP Det. Kenneth Watson testified Tuesday during an ongoing first-degree murder trial in Superior Court in

Milton.

"He (Mr. Andreopoulos) had two partners and he said both names of the people involved. He talked about the specific date."

The detective also testified the former Milton resident told him that he kept an OPP flyer about the disappearance of Mr. Andreopoulos, 36, of Barrie at his Brampton home and showed it to the officer when they returned.

Mr. Andreopoulos was last seen with the accused on July 2, 1998. His badly decomposed body was

discovered on a Derry Road property 18 months later.

The confession came after the two met with Det. Watson's purported boss, Det. Bill Campbell, September 23, 1997, at a hotel located along the airport strip.

The three met to discuss a fictitious hit the two were doing for Det. Campbell.

Also on Tuesday, the jury heard that Det. Watson met Mr. Fiorino on September 17, 1997 at his home to discuss the hit.

The trial continued yesterday.

# Tire thieves at work
