The event will feature a cocktail reception at 7 p.m. and a performance at 8 p.m.

A portion of the evening's proceeds will go to Rose Cherry's Home, Ontario's first hospice for terminally and chronically ill kids.

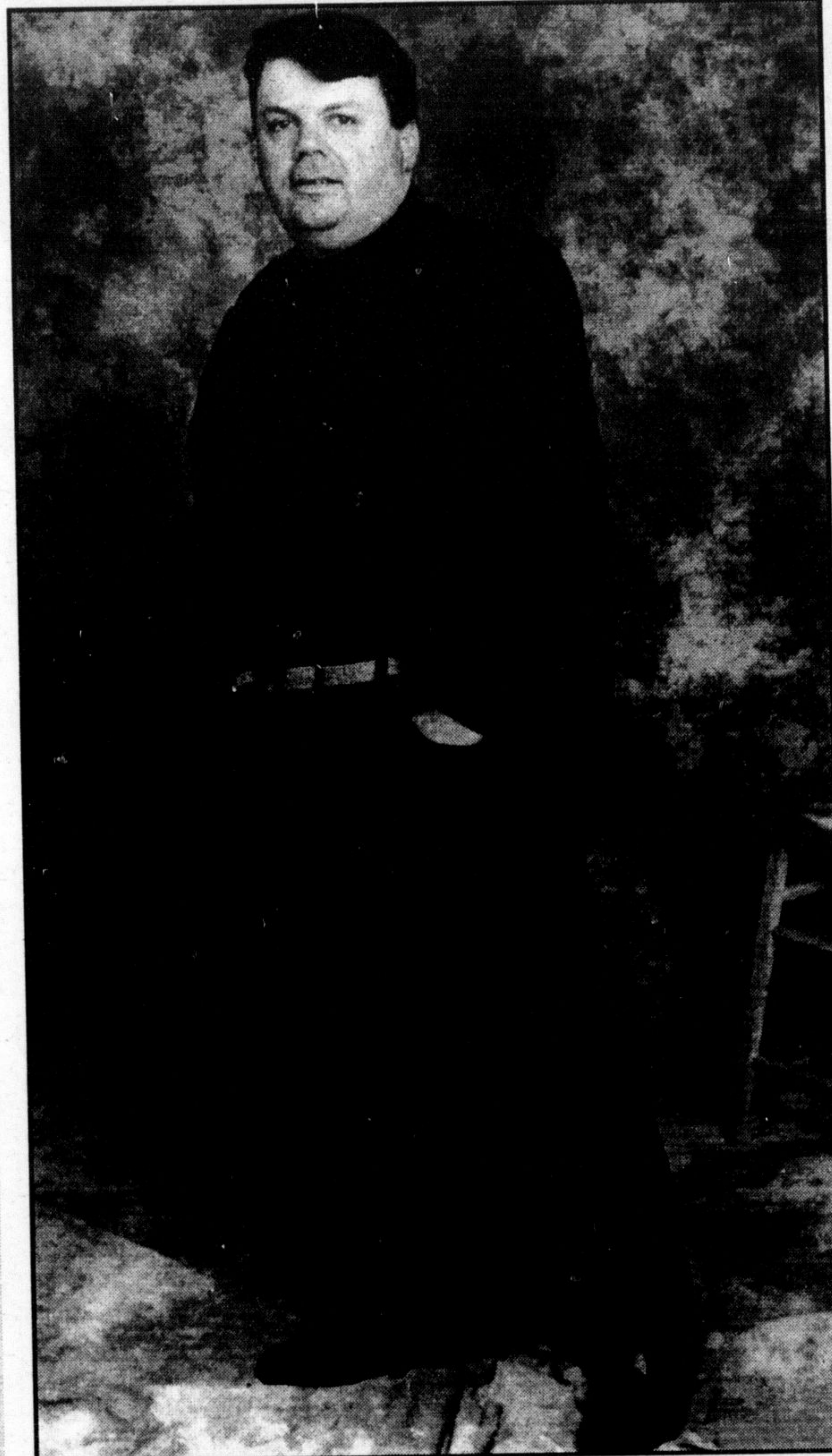
The celebration comes shortly after Father Curtis' attendance last Friday at

He also sang at the event, in the end pocketing a \$2,000 cheque for the Rose Cherry Home.

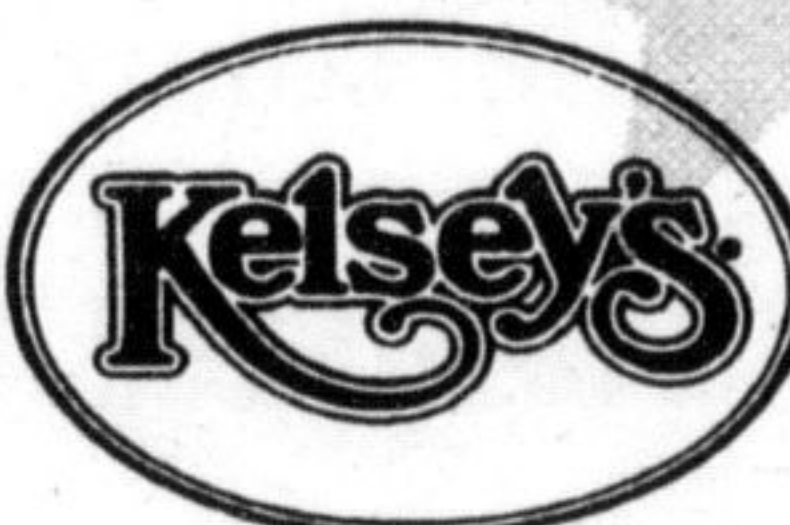

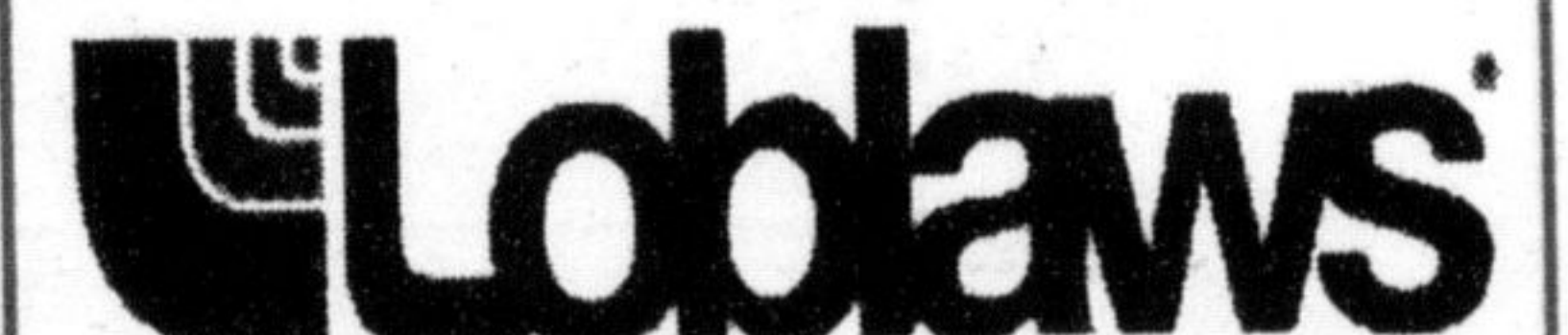
