

QUICK LUBE Murder suspect started to catch on to wire taps: trial

Unless David Fiorino could come up with solid proof that he killed Stephen Andreopoulos, the fictitious hit would be off, the jury heard Friday during an ongoing first-degree murder trial in Superior Court in Milton.

The jury has heard that the accused Mr. Fiorino, 27, and undercover OPP officer Det. Kenneth Watson were collaborating on a hit for the officer's purported boss, Det. Bill Campbell.

On October 2, 1997, Det. Watson is heard on taped intercepts asking the former Milton resident to get a finger of the deceased for proof that he had killed before, the jury heard.

Mr. Andreopoulos, 36, of Barrie was last seen leaving a Maple, Ont. gas station with the accused July 2, 1996. His body was discovered on a Derry Road property 18 months later.

Mr. Fiorino is heard telling Det. Watson that it was impossible to go back to the body as there were people around.

The officer, who befriended the accused on the August long weekend in 1997, told him he needed

the proof in 24 hours or the deal would be off.

"One way or another, I'll take care of it," Mr. Fiorino said.

The next day, Det. Watson received a page from Mr. Fiorino who told him to stay low.

Det. Watson returned the call and told the accused the deal was off.

On Thursday, the jury heard more intercepted conversations between the two men.

The jury has heard that Det. Watson was wearing a niagra, or body pack, and his car had probes in it. Mr. Fiorino's home also had probes in it and his phones were tapped.

Justice John Bellegham reminded the jury the tapes were the evidence and the transcripts were just

a guide. He said it was the jury who was responsible for deciding if the accused said what was attributed to him and what it meant.

On September 23, 1997, Mr. Fiorino and Det. Watson discussed the July 2, 1996 liquor deal.

"It's been in all the papers bud," Mr. Fiorino is heard saying. "Stephen Andreopoulos. They had the flyers floating around Maple. It happened on July 2 of last year. I have the actual flyer."

Mr. Fiorino told the detective he was taking a bit of heat because the victim's partners — Jim Pearson and Dominco Sacco — mentioned his name.

He also told the detective that the missing person's flyer contained a picture of Mr. Andreopoulos and the rented U-Haul he was last seen

"That's the guy you popped?," Det. Watson asked.

"Yep," Mr. Fiorino responded. Mr. Fiorino said he had to be careful so he didn't get caught.

"I love what I got. I'm not going to lose it," he's heard saying.

When asked, Mr. Fiorino told the detective his wife Kimberly didn't know he killed a man.

"I didn't have the heart to tell her. (I killed a person) just to put that diamond ring on her finger."

The trial continued yesterday.
