

United Way golf tournament to be held at Granite Ridge

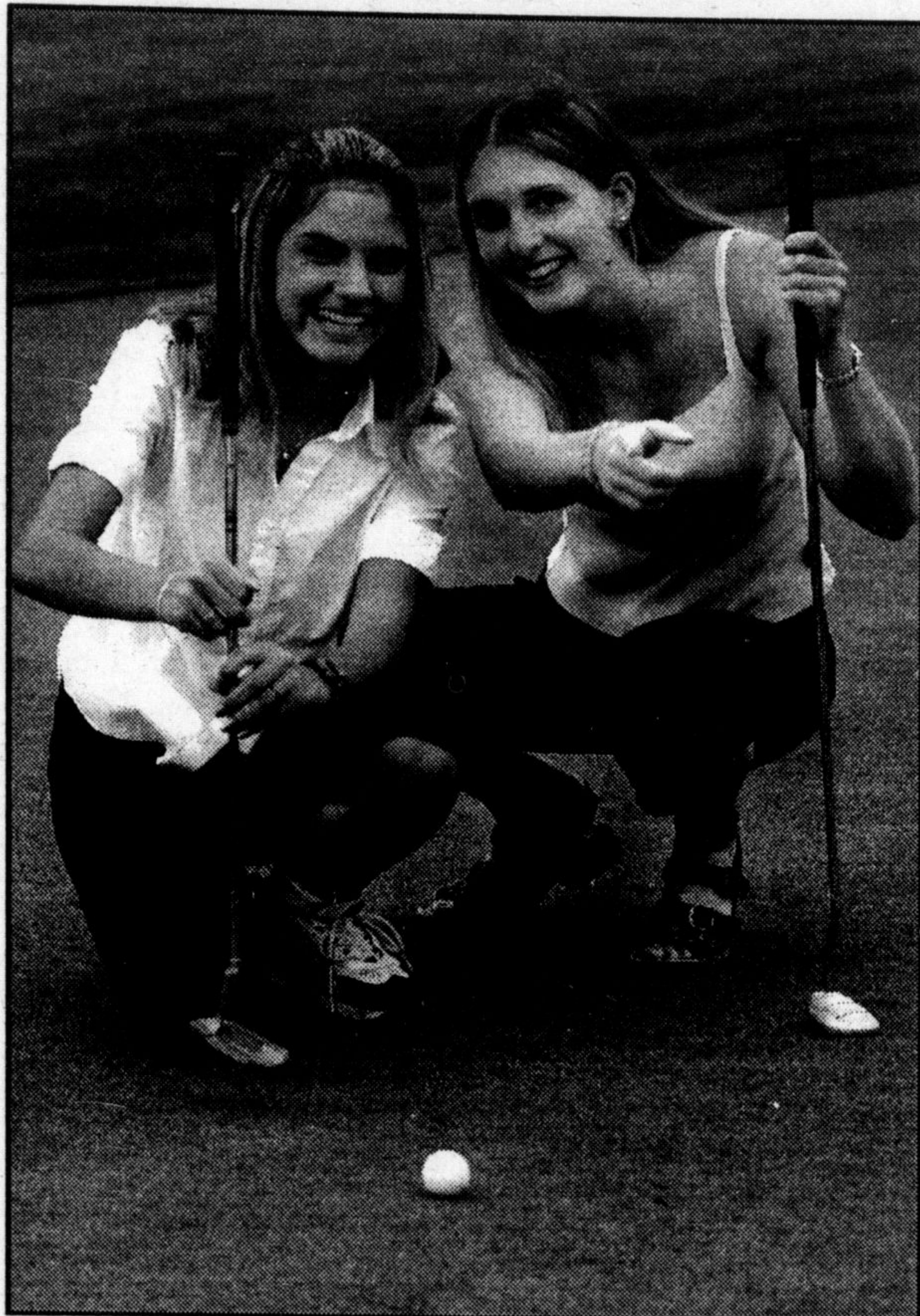

The United Way of Milton has always had an expansive mandate.

So it's no surprise it's sixth annual golf tournament is getting bigger as well.

This year, the fundraising event will be held Tuesday, Sept. 19 at Granite Ridge Golf Club, located at 9503 Dublin Line, north of Campbellville Sideroad.

For the first time, an 18-hole tournament will replace the nine-hole game that has been in place for the past five years.

"We just thought it was time for a change," said tournament chair Hal Watson.

The cost is \$150, which includes green fees, cart and dinner.

The shotgun start takes place at 1:30 p.m.

The tournament features various draws, as well as prizes for categories such as top score, longest drive and most honest golfer.

In past years, the tournament has netted between \$10,000 and \$13,000 per event.

But this year the United Way is hoping for a bigger haul.

"We're hoping we can jump up to \$20,000 or so," said Mr. Watson. "We'll need to sell about 144 tickets to do that."

The event's main sponsor is the Donaldson Financial Group, and other top sponsors include Mattamy Homes, Johnson Controls and Quik X Transportation Inc.
