School board's 'policy governance' to be introduced after the elections

Halton school board trustees will wait until January before radically overhauling the way they do business.

Instead of introducing the new methods starting next month, 'policy governance' won't be introduced until after the next board takes over. Elections are set for November.

Policy governance has been described as a new system in which trustees develop and monitor policies, then hold the director responsible.

Critics think it diminishes a trustee's decision-making power in favour of the director. Advocates think it builds teamwork, promotes consensus and gives the board of trustees more power.

A vote to delay the onset of policy governance sparked a heated debate among trustees during Wednesday's meeting of the Halton District School Board.

Burlington's Sheila Flook wanted to delay implementation until June, 2001, but she failed to win support. Among her reasons was a desire to seek more input from board staff, and to let the next board determine how it wants to do business.

But January was reached as a compromise position, one backed by Burlington Trustee Michael Ellis, who also supported bringing in a facilitator to help train the next board, and help inform students and school councils on the new policy governance model.

"If we rush into this we could create turmoil in the system."

Other costs of the open house are largely being swallowed by plaza owner, Ricenberg Development Ltd.


"They've very generously offered to cover the costs," said Ms Campanella.

"This is something good," said Mr. Petrusich. "I think it's prudent to move ahead now. If we delay, things don't get better."
