We'll see what's in the cards for development

It has been more than a year since slot machines were added to Mohawk Raceway, but it appears gambling has finally caught on.

How else to explain the daring roll of the dice performed by the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) recently?

It opted to launch an appeal to cabinet of a joint board ruling on the development potential of approximately 100 hectares of land leading up to the escarpment.

The ruling turned one bid down flat, but put a second on hold until a detailed concept plan is submitted by the applicant.

The NEC position has always been that both properties belong in the protective Niagara Escarpment Plan, which aims to preserve precious escarpment vistas. To that end, the appeal explicitly asked that cabinet reject both bids.

Which could happen. But cabinet could also decide that each property should be untethered from the restrictive plan.

In other words, simply launching the appeal has brought the rejected bid back into the game, and could thaw the one currently on ice.

The majority of voting members of the NEC were within their rights to play this hand. One can only hope they're sure of the cards.
