# Book in second printing

The Conservation Halton Foundation's fundraising book 'Halton: Rising, Wild and Beckoning' is now in its second printing after 8,000 copies sold out.

Sales of the book have so far raised about \$200,000 for the Mountsberg Visitor Centre, said Sarah Lowe, foundation director and chair of the book com-

"The book has not only raised considerable funds for conservation, but has also raised awareness of the watershed's significant natural environment and important work of Conservation Halton," she said.

The book is a guide to Halton's watershed that includes such unique features as the Niagara Escarpment, Carolinian forests, Lake Ontario shoreline, creeks, valleys and rich wetlands.

The hardcover book features 160 photographs, 16 coloured maps showing scenic drives and trails and a full-colour fold-out map with dozens of natural and cultural features listed on it.

Each chapter in the book is introduced by interesting people such as astronaut Dr. Roberta Bondar, patron of the visitor centre campaign, David Crombie, chair of the Lake Ontario Waterfront Regeneration Trust and Robert Bateman, international wildlife artist.

The book costs \$39.95 and is available in bookstores throughout Halton. People can also purchase a limited millennium edition of the book that has a gold embossed sleeve and is autographed by Dr. Bondar.
