Murder trial wrapping up

But according to Ms Kerr, the plan — agreed to by Mr. Andreopoulos and his partners Dominic Sacco and Jim Pearson — was already in existence.

The jury heard that one of the partners would follow the accused to Cornwall. Once there, Mr. Fiorino would meet his source and exchange the money for the booze. Mr. Fiorino would later meet up with the partner.

While Ms Kerr had maintained that a plan was already in place, Mr. Fiorino had disagreed.

"Why did you not wait and go down to Cornwall to do the rip-off down there?" Mr. Nuttall asked.

Mr. Fiorino replied that there was no reason to go to Cornwall since the liquor deal was cancelled. He said he was looking for a place in Toronto to rip Mr. Andreopoulos off.

"And if you couldn't find another place?" Mr. Nuttall asked.

"It may not have happened," Mr.

Fiorino testified.

Robert Spraklin also testified Monday. The jury learned Mr. Spraklin was introduced to Mr. Fiorino by his friend Al Porter, who's an uncle of Mr. Fiorino's wife Kimberly.

Mr. Spraklin told the jury his first business relationship with the accused was to sell him cheater boxes — an illegal device that would allow the bearer to get free cable. The relationship then moved to contraband alcohol, he testified.

After selling several cases to the accused, Mr. Spraklin testified he was asked if he could get a trailer full of booze.

Mr. Spraklin testified that a red flag went up to his supplier when he asked about the quantity. He said he called Mr. Fiorino back and told him he couldn't do it.

The jury heard Mr. Fiorino then asked for the name of the supplier, which Mr. Spraklin refused to give.

"He was interested in my supplier and I wasn't interested in doing

that," Mr. Spraklin said. "He was looking to cut out the middle man and that was me."

Mr. Spraklin said the accused called him several times afterward but he never returned his calls.

During cross examination, Ms Kerr read from a transcript between the accused and undercover officer OPP Det. Kenneth Watson. In it, Mr. Fiorino tells the officer about Mr. Spraklin.

Mr. Fiorino told the officer that Mr. Spraklin took him to his warehouse that was filled with booze and equipment.

While listening, Mr. Spraklin began to smile, then he started to silently laugh.

When Ms Kerr said he didn't have a warehouse brimming with alcohol, Mr. Spraklin responded, "That's for sure."

The trial will continue Thursday with the defence's closing arguments. Next Friday, Mr. O'Marra is expected to make his closing arguments.

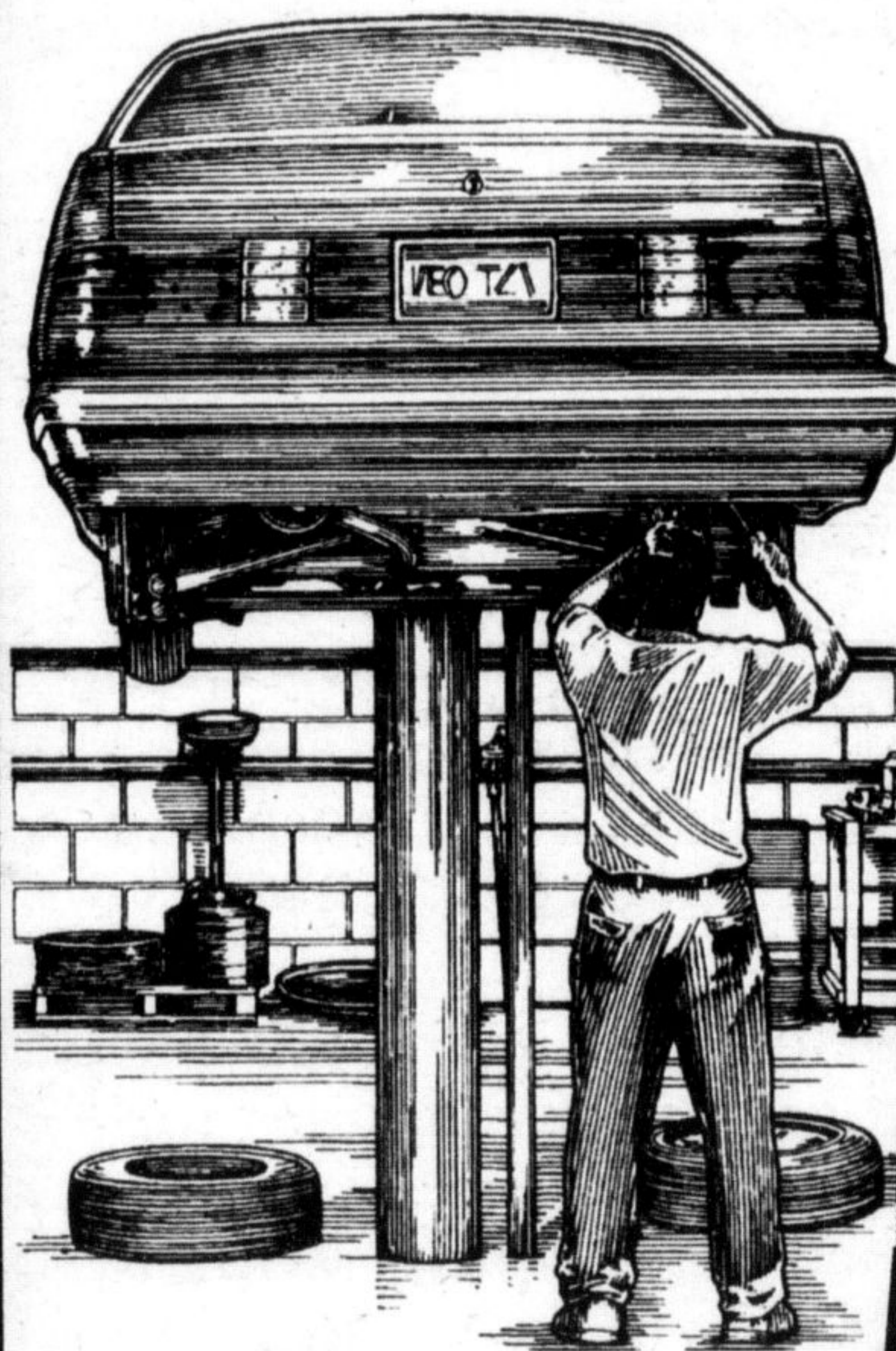
