## Peeping tom looking in Commercial St. windows

A Commercial Street townhouse complex has been targeted by a peeping tom.

Over the past couple of weeks police have received four reports of a man looking into the bedroom windows of young female residents of the complex, which backs onto the ravine.

The incident occurred on Beaver Court at about 4:15 a.m.




