Miltonian Heather Manbert-Serniuk recently made her greatest leap in quest of a topfive finish on the Jump Canada Series.

The 34-year-old show jumper delivered a sensational second-place performance and collected 42.9 points at the September 24 Tournament of Champions in Ottawa.

As a result, she and trusty mount Just Julia — a nineyear-old Dutch Warmblood mare — overtook Frankie Chesler and Hanastasia for fifth spot in the season standings.

However, Chesler remains the overall leader with another

11-year-old horse, Hannoverian mare Ravenna Z. She also sits second with 12year-old bay Holstein gelding Sylver 2.

Chesler's first and second place horses boast 183.2 and 151.2 points respectively.

Meanwhile, Manbert-Serniuk's 113.55 points still give her an outside shot at placing top three on the 16-event tour. Assuming that is, she enjoys a strong showing at the series-ending Audi Quattro "World Cup" November 8th at Toronto's Royal Horse Show.
