Superb two-way effort

Alana Zelek was clearly the best player on either side and was all over the field for BR.

She made great defensive plays, was dominant in the middle and was instrumental in getting the ball into the Loyala scoring area.

Kim Durante, who has anchored the defense all season, suffered a re-occurring wrist injury and had to be sidelined for part of the game, but gamely went back in the

second half.

Meanwhile, Rebecca Ketelaars, one of the team's most improved players, made several good plays on defense to compensate for her absence.

Loyola went up 2-0 on a diving score late in the second half, putting the Royals behind the eight ball.

They didn't give up, however, and had a several more good scoring chances, including some by Karen Marchment and Durante, who moved up to forward.

Coach Jim Gallant was not displeased with the team's effort. "I thought that we played one of the best games we've had all season. They were very aggressive and disciplined.

"I thought we dominated the Loyola team even though they outscored us. We had our chances — at least four or five chances to score — and just couldn't capitalize."

He was also impressed by the team's improvement. "We went into the season knowing Appleby and Oakville-Trafalgar would be powerhouses. My goal was to make the playoffs and to see some improvement over the season. We brought in a lot of new players.

"Other schools have a junior team to draw from, but part of our team was Grade nine and 10 players, so I was really proud that these players came up to the senior level and did as well as they did."

As a measurement, Gallant noted that early in the season the Royals lost 8-0 to Appleby, a private school with their own artificial turf field.

Late in the year, Bishop Reding only lost 2-0, and Appleby wasn't able to score until well into the second half.

He had high praise for the excellent seasons Zelek and Durante had, along with all the newcomers, including Ketelaars, Dick, and Nicole Perreia.


Of their goalie, Gallant said, "Heather Townsend has been awesome in goal. She kept us in games in which we could have got blown away."
