WATCH OUT Young woman held at knife point during evening attack

Halton Regional Police are warning women not to walk by themselves after a 16-year-old female was grabbed from behind and had a knife placed at her throat.

The young woman was walking north on Martin Street at about 10:30 p.m. Wednesday when she was attacked.

She was able to get away after a brief struggle.

The police and K9 unit were called to the area, but were unable to find the suspect.

The man was last seen heading south on Martin

Street.

He is described as a white male, five-foot eight with a medium build and dark hair. He was wearing a dark jacket and blue jeans.

Det. Sgt. Jackie Gordon said its likely the suspect was attempting to pull the Mississauga resident into the nearby bush.

"Females should either partner up or don't attempt to walk by themselves until the police are done conducting their investigation," Det. Sgt. Gordon said.

The investigation began yesterday morning.


Gas leak in Brookville

Construction crews are working on the roads in the area.






