Congratulations to all students who made last year's honour role or who received an academic award. On Thursday, October 26th these students received a breakfast that celebrated academic excellence.

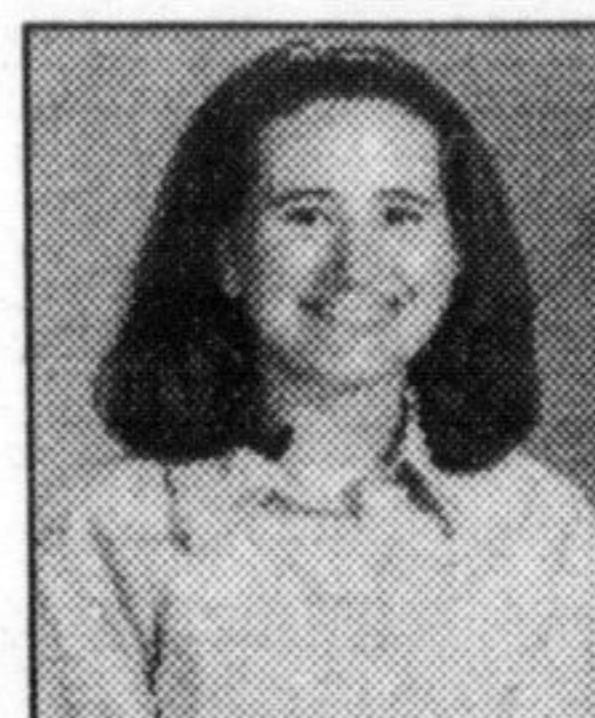
