

#### Beat the Bug!!!

The staff at both the Milton District Hospital and the Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital have been busy rolling up their sleeves, not because of the warmer than usual temperatures outside, but because they are all pitching in to beat the bug" this winter.



To-date more than 50% of the healthcare providers at both sites have received flu shots. Travelling flu carts and a daily flu shot clinic are just two of the activities taking place to promote immunization.

#### Asthma Education Centre Expands

If you or someone in your family has Asthma, you may be able to benefit from the new Asthma Education Centre which has recently opened at Milton District Hospital. Through education and hands on practice, you can learn to take control of your Asthma and optimize the quality of your life.

"Knowledge dispels the mystery and fear generally associated with asthma and empowers the patient with effective self-management strategies," says Eileen Gagne, Co-ordinator of the Asthma Education Centre who is also a Respiratory Care Practitioner and a Certified Asthma

Educator. "We work together with the patient and their doctor to plan ways to control symptoms, prevent attacks and successfully stop an asthma attack in progress."

Following your doctor's referral to the Centre Eileen will work with you and your family to determine, among other things, what triggers your asthma and how to recognize when your asthma is getting out of control.

"It isn't easy to identify what is making someone's asthma worse. We usually ask patients to keep a diary to track their symptoms to see if there is a pattern that links a particular place or activity with the symptom," adds Ms. Gagne. "We also have a variety of easy to understand resource materials and lots of practical tips on how to avoid asthma triggers."

The Asthma Education Centre at MDH is open every Thursday from 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm. Appointments are available with a doctor's referral. Please call 338-4691 for additional information.


#### LOOKING FOR A SPECIAL CHRISTMAS GIFT FOR A SPECIAL PERSON?
