The goal for Alex Brancier — a 15-yearold in the novice division — was to qualify through the Northeast Region Championships for the U.S. Open Invitational on November 24 in


that and more. Racers have to qualify through the motos in order to make it to the main event, which Brancier did handily — finishing first, second and third.
