# Dynamite found in wooded area

Halton Regional Police have disposed of 170 sticks of deteriorating dynamite that were found in a bush on First Line west of No. 25 Sideroad November 7.

The dynamite — which according to police had remained hidden in the wooded area for quite some time — was discov-

ered by a local resident hunting in the area at about 4 p.m.

It's still unknown how the explosive got there.

### Hit by pellet gun

A 15-year-old male was hit in the thumb with a pellet gun while walking down Main Street with two friends November 10.

Upon passing Grace Anglican Church, the three parties heard the sound of the gun being discharged and one of the males was then hit in the right thumb — breaking the skin but not causing serious injury.

Police were later notified but the culprits were gone by the time they arrived.

### Suspicious male

Police are urging residents to be weary of door-to-door solicitors following a complaint of a suspicious male Saturday.

The man — driving a green Sunfire — came calling at a home on Laurier Avenue and told the owners he was conducting a smoking survey.

He was asked to supply credentials, but none were shown and he quickly left.

The man was described as being 5-foot-10 and 160 pounds with blond hair and blue eyes.

### Police radio swiped

A portable police radio was stolen from

the Fifth Wheel Truck Stop November 4 after an officer inadvertently left it behind at 2:20 p.m.

The suspects were caught on video leaving with the radio — an Ericsson GE model PKI ZGT, valued at roughly \$2,000 — and they've been asked to contact police and tell them where it can be picked up.

The radio is no longer in service.

### Impaired charges

Drunk driving charges were laid after a motorist driving a blue Chevrolet Suburban ran a stop sign and ended up in a ditch at Steeles Avenue and Peru Road November 9.

The incident occurred at about 11 p.m.

A 38-year-old Oakville man was charged with impaired driving and driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.

He'll appear in Milton court December 4.
