Allendale earns high praise from health agency

Ontario Street long-term-care facility recognized for outstanding client care and services for residents in home-like evnvironment

Allendale harvested high praise after earning its third back-to-back, three-year accreditation recently.

The analysis was conducted by the Canadian Council on Health Services Accreditation. It examines health care sites with the aim

of gauging performance levels in relation to national standards. Often, accreditation comes along with tips on how to improve the facility over the next few years.

But this time, the award arrived with nothing tacked on but laurels for the Region's long-term-care facility.

"The report card came back without any recommendations. That's significant," said Halton's Social Services Commissioner Adelina Urbanski. "This is really a validation."

During an accreditation review, everything from resident care to governance and human resources comes under the microscope. "They went through everything," said Ms Urbanski. "It was

quite a thorough process."

The report also praised follow-up work done by Allendale after previous reviews.

"The organization has made good progress since its previous accreditation survey," the report read. "This is a very clientfocused organization in which residents' needs come first. Feedback from residents and their families has been positive."

As someone who was involved at the tail end of the evaluation, Halton Chair Joyce Savoline said the process was both detailed and difficult.

"This isn't an easy process to go through," she said. "It makes us turn ourselves inside out. It makes us totally transparent. We are public with every wrinkle."


