

Two vehicles crash into tractor-trailer unit blocking Derry Road

A 36-year-old Toronto man has been charged with criminal negligence causing bodily harm in connection with two traffic accidents on Derry Road November 16.

Halton Regional Police report that at about 11:10 p.m. a tractor-trailer was parked across both lanes of Derry Road while a bulldozer in the back of the unit was unloaded at a new subdivision on Trudeau Road.

No warning lights or flag men were in place and two vehicles — both heading westbound — subsequently collided with the unit. One of the drivers suffered injuries that required hospitalization.

The two vehicles were demolished and the tractor-trailer sustained \$2,500 damage.

Staff assaulted

A 29-year-old Welland man faces two counts of assault following a disturbance at Yahoos nightclub last Friday.

Two staff members were assaulted after trying to help a man who was being attacked by a small group of men outside the establishment at about 9:30 p.m., police said.

The fight stemmed from an altercation between male patrons inside the bar earlier in the night, police said.

Costly joyride

Two youths got more than they bargained for during an afternoon joyride November 15.

Using keys they'd acquired earlier in the day, the youths took a 2000 Chevrolet C22 without permission from one of the local high schools at about 2:35 p.m.

A short time later on Appleby Line the youths were involved in a single-vehicle accident, causing extensive damage to the \$20,000 car. They then fled the scene.

Two 16-year-olds were arrested and face counts of taking the vehicle without con-

sent while one of the suspects has also been charged with dangerous driving. They'll appear in Milton court December 15.

Hefty haul

More than \$5,000 worth of property was taken during a break-in at an Eighth Line residence Monday.

Sometime between 3 and 3:30 p.m., an unknown culprit smashed a kitchen window and once inside the home removed a camcorder, binoculars and an undisclosed amount of cash.

Vehicles stolen

A number of vehicles have been report-

ed stolen or recovered in town recently. The incidents are as follows:

- A 1988 Chevrolet Cavalier, valued at \$1,000, that was stolen from St. Thomas two months ago was found at 122 Bronte St. last Friday. The vehicle was discovered with its door ajar and the steering column damaged.

- Sometime last weekend a '95 Dodge Neon was stolen from 100 Millside Dr. The vehicle was valued at approximately \$7,000. Around the same time an '87 Nissan Maxima — stolen from Mississauga — was recovered at the same apartment complex. The engine was running and no damage was reported.

- A '91 Pontiac SLE — with an estimated value of \$5,000 — was stolen from a Cabot Trail residence overnight November 15.

Police seek radio thieves

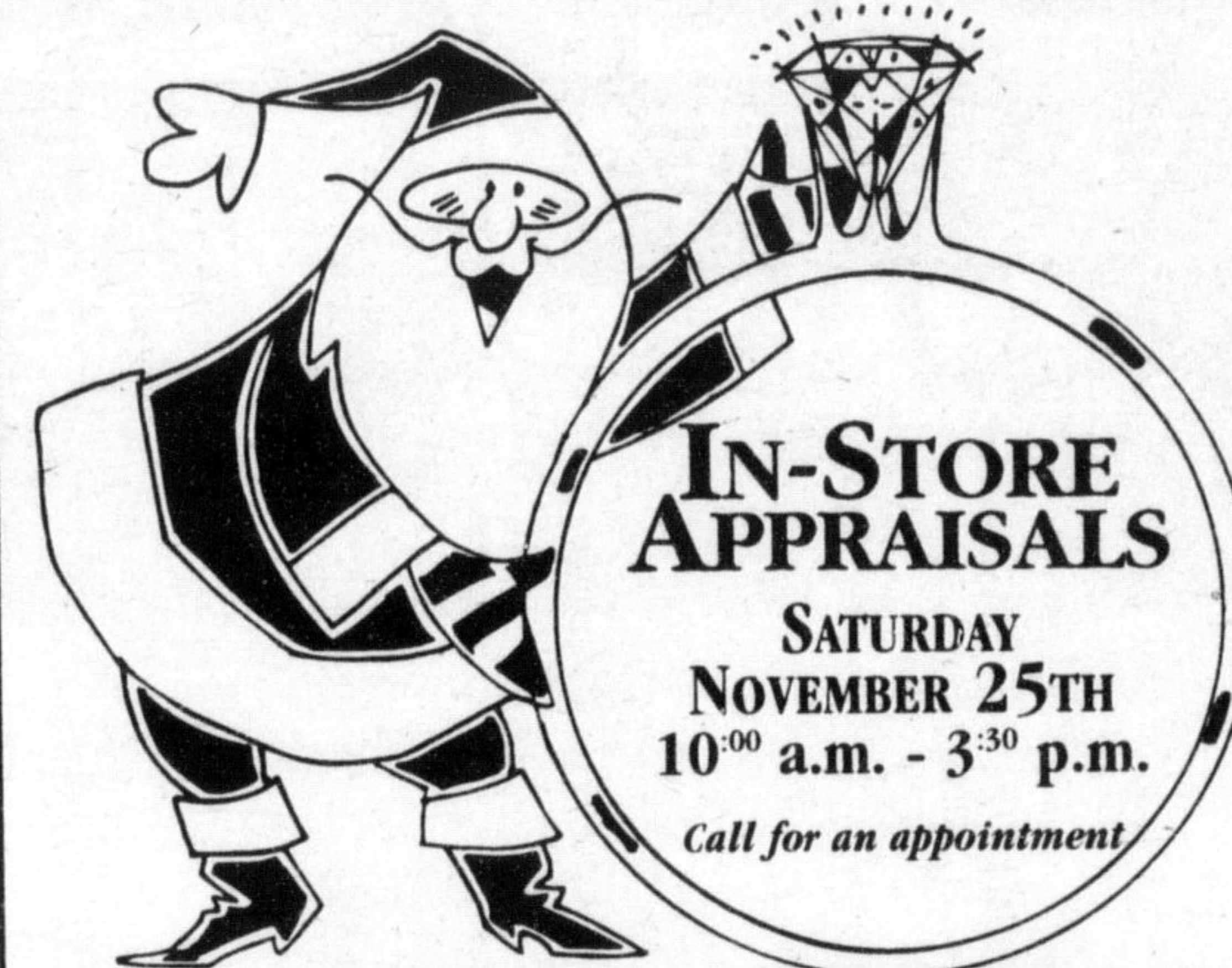
