Minor baseball in dire need of rep coaches

Milton Minor Baseball will more than likely stay afloat for another year, thanks to a recent infusion of volunteer support.

But one pivotal part of the ship may still sink — unless specific assistance is found, and soon.

The association's half-dozen rep teams are currently without coaches in place for 2001.

The entire contingent have abandoned their posts, and thus far no replacement skippers have come forward. At least none with proper certification. And without coaches, a local rep program will cease to exist next season.

So in an effort to quickly replenish the now non-existent rep coaching ranks, MMBA will hold a recruiting session this coming Wednesday at 8 p.m. at the Milton Seniors' Activity Centre.

MMBA President Sandy Tellier said it's certainly disappointing that all the rep coaches have left at once — but also somewhat understandable, given the number of years many have put in without a break.

"We're in a league with much bigger centres and it's frustrating for some of these coaches to keep losing year after year," said Tellier, who added increased competition with soccer and lacrosse have hurt local baseball's numbers and subsequently its competitiveness.

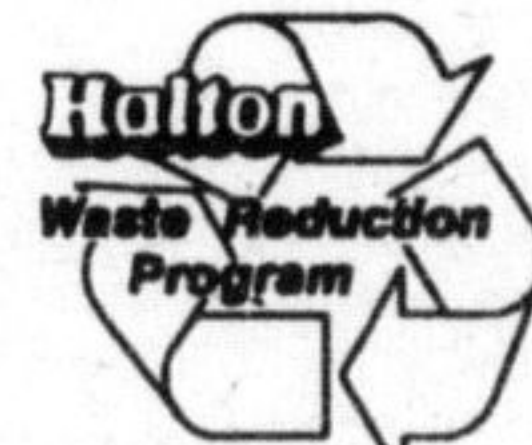
But as discouraged as the league president may be about dwindling numbers, she's much more focused on rectifying the situation — or at least improving it.

"Milton not having a rep system next year would be pretty pathetic."

She said those interested in coaching but who've never done so before will be offered direction at the meeting on how to obtain proper certification.



Milton Residents: YARD WASTE COLLECTION WILL SOON END!



Yard Waste will continue every other week on your Blue Box day until the week of November 27th 2000. Place materials curbside by 7:30 a.m.

- Please keep **Yard Waste separate from your garbage and blue box**. This avoids confusion during collection.
- **Yard Waste must be placed in clear plastic bags** (dark bags will not be collected), large paper yard waste bags or small open containers (no garbage cans).
- **Brush must be bundled and tied**, not bagged, no larger than **4 feet long by 2 feet diameter with branches a maximum of 3 inches diameter**.
- **Yard Waste bags or containers must be no heavier than 23 kg (50 pounds)**.
- **Grasscycle** by leaving grass clippings on your lawn as mulch!
- **Composting** (backyard or vermicomposting) can divert up to 20% of waste going to landfill.
